



Danny Baker Finishes the 2019 Tower Rock 10K

About now you are saying – SO? Well Danny Baker is BLIND! Danny is a long time resident of the Flaming Gorge Pines Community located just west of the Flaming Gorge Dam. Danny spends the summer there in a striking log home which he, with the help of his family, built themselves in the early 1990's.

For the past few years, Danny has been spending the winters in the Millcreek area of Salt Lake City. There he has worked out at the gym in the Millcreek Community Center on E. Evergreen Ave. That's where Danny met Jack Torrey during a treadmill workout. Jack observed Danny running for a few days and then asks Danny if he would like to go running outdoors for a change. Jack fabricated a short lanyard from parachute cord and started introducing Danny to running outside around Millcreek and Sugarhouse Park. That led to entering the Tower Rock Run 10K and finishing with a good performance.

Danny spent a career with Queststar, the gas storage company, until his vision degraded from macular degeneration. However, that did not stop Danny from living a full and busy life. Danny stays up to date listening to NPR and Foundation for the Blind audio material ranging from magazines to books. His genre of audio ranges from light to classics such as War and Peace. Danny stays physically busy at the Pines walking to the mail box each day and doing improvement/repairs around his home. His ability to improve and repair things is beyond amazing. One of Danny's frequent saying is "I can do most things I use to do, it just takes longer".


If you find you need a booster to your attitude or mental state just think of Danny Baker!

Recipe of the Month

Dutch Baby Pancake

INGREDIENTS

3 TABLESPOONS BUTTER

3 EGGS

3/4 CUP MILK

3/4 CUP FLOUR

1/4 TEASPOON SALT

1/4 TEASPOON VANILLA

LEMON WEDGES

CONFECTIONER'S SUGAR



1. Preheat oven to 425°F. Place butter in a 10" skillet or heavy baking dish and place in oven while preheating. Remove the pan before butter starts to brown.
2. In the meantime, beat eggs until foamy; add milk, flour, salt and vanilla and blend together until just mixed.
3. Pour into hot skillet and return to oven for approximately 25 minutes until gold-en brown and puffed.
4. Remove the pancake from oven and dust with confectioner's sugar. Serve im-mediately with lemon wedges and extra pats of butter. When the lemon juice mixes with the confectioner's sugar it makes a creamy lemony sauce that is perfect.
