## Mutual Self Help Housing Program

### What is Self Help Housing?

Self Help Housing is a program for low income families who want to achieve the dream of home ownership. Qualified families work together under the supervision of a Construction Manager to construct their homes.

### Who Qualifies?

Anyone who:

- Has the desire to achieve home ownership
- Does not have an existing mortgage
- Does not exceed the annual income guidelines
- Has good credit and can qualify for a mortgage to cover the cost of building
- Is capable of fulfilling the 30 hour per week labor contribution requirement

# Daggett County Celebrates Completion of 68-Mile Fiber-optic Project

Mountain Terrain Required Diamond Drilling Rigs to Cut Trenches through Solid Rock

It's not every day you get to celebrate the literal moving of mountains, but it will happen Wednesday, September 2, in Manila, Utah. The event will mark the completion of a \$6 million dollar, three-year project to bring more than 68.7 miles of fiber-optic infrastructure for broadband to Manila, Dutch John and the scenic Flaming Gorge Dam recreation area in rural Daggett County.

About 28 miles of that fiber pathway from the Uintah Basin required a 100,000 pound carbon-tipped rock saw digging five-foot trenches through solid rock. To accomplish the feat, a crew of nine workers lived in trailers along mountainous US Highway 191 for more than year. By project's end, about 900,000 tons solid rock was excavated for a fiber-optic conduit and the fragile glass fiber it houses. The light traveling through those fibers now brings gigabit connectivity supporting healthcare, education and commerce to the county.



“Utah students and educators, patients and physicians should have access to the best technology no matter where they live,” said UETN CEO Ray Timothy. “Broadband is a necessity to promote growth in communities, business, tourism, education and healthcare.” With Daggett’s annual influx of more than 2-million visitor days (a family of four staying four days equals 16 visitor days), the need for telehealth connectivity has never been more urgent.

“Telehealth services are dependent on high speed internet connectivity in rural communities, which is why we are so thrilled about this accomplishment,” said UETN Associate Director for Telehealth Matt McCullough. “Uintah Basin Healthcare’s Manila Clinic is a great example of a small rural clinic that had minimal connectivity and now has access to high speed fiber. Some cases can now be handled through telehealth rather than expensive and time consuming trips to a hospital.”

“The Daggett school district was among the last two districts in the state not fully connected to fiber for its schools in Manila and Dutch John”, said UETN associate director Jeff Egly who helped initiate and complete the project. “The district helped pioneer distance learning decades ago with analog equipment and now it will have state of the art connectivity thanks to this project.”

The project required a high degree of collaboration. Partners include Daggett County, Daggett County School District, Federal Communications Commission, STRATA Networks, US Bureau of Reclamation, US Forest Service, Utah Education and Telehealth Network, and the Utah State Legislature.

The Daggett Fiber Completion Celebration will be held Wednesday at 3:00 p.m. at Manila High School and online. # RECIPE OF THE MONTH

## skillet chicken with grapes and caramelized onions

### INGREDIENTS

for the caramelized onions

2 tablespoons butter

1 yellow onion, thinly sliced

for the chicken:

1/2 cup flour

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon chili powder

1/4 teaspoon thyme

1/4 teaspoon allspice

2 lbs. chicken thighs with skin (4-5)

2 tablespoons oil

3/4 cup dry red wine

1/2 cup chicken broth

2 cups red California grapes

parsley for topping



To caramelize the onions, heat the butter over medium low heat in a heavy ovenproof skillet. Add the onions cook for 20 minutes or so, stirring occasionally. When the onions are a deep golden color, remove from the pan and set aside.

To make the chicken, preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Combine the flour, salt, chili powder, thyme, allspice, and black pepper. Dredge each piece of chicken in the flour mixture, shaking off the excess.

In the same pan as the onions, heat the oil over medium high heat. Add each piece of chicken skin-side down and fry for a few minutes until golden brown; flip and cook for a few more minutes. Transfer to a plate (if it's not fully cooked, that's okay – it will finish in the oven – the idea here is just getting it browned on the outside).

Turn the heat down and let the oil cool off a little bit. Add the wine – this will definitely bubble and sizzle! Add the broth and simmer until the mixture is thickened slightly. Add the onions and chicken to the pan (skin side up) and bake for 20 minutes.

Remove from the oven, add the grapes, baste with the sauce, and bake for another 5-10 minutes. Top with parsley and serve with a green salad, bread, quinoa, rice, etc.

Our fun loving, jokester, overall wearing, mountain man left us for his heavenly mountain on August 18, 2020 after complications following a stroke.

Val was born on October 27, 1932 the oldest of four children born to Joseph Ellis (Buck) and Mildred Burton Holbrook.

His favorite place to be was outdoors, especially in the mountains. This great love was set deep in his heart as a young boy by his Dad, Grandparents, and Uncles. He learned a love of fishing first being around 3 years old. The family would travel to Woodruff and Morgan where he would always catch his limit. During his teenage years he learned to fly fish and it became his passion. He studied the art of tying his own and would know exactly what the fish in a particular stream, river or lake preferred. He had his favorite way of cooking the fish he caught, but was always learning new ways. special seasonings, then tinfoil and into the fire they would go. At one point he learned to smoke fish purchasing a smoker. He would smoke all kinds but he was renowned for his smoked Kokanee Salmon from Flaming Gorge. He loved the Kokanee Salmon so much that he purchased a place in Manila near Flaming Gorge so he could fish every day and be on the water at dawn. He loved the people of Manila and would have fun at the Senior Citizen's Center, especially teasing everyone and telling jokes, when he wasn't on the water.

Val was an extraordinarily skilled mechanic and carpenter, there wasn't anything he couldn't fix or build. He could put together/and or fix pretty much any motor from cars, trucks and tractors to snowmobiles and everything in between. He was a master welder and purchased a welder for himself. In the late 1950's he built his own speed boat, trailer and also a camper. He also learned the art of wood burning and made beautiful gifts. He used his carpentry talent to fulfill a childhood dream to have a model train, and he did it in a big way, it filled  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the basement family room! He built towns, mountains, valleys and rivers, it was magnificent.

## CONSERVATION DISTRICT AWARDS RADOSEVICH & WILDE

Conservation districts were created nationwide in 1952. In that 68 year span, Alex Radosevich and Jon Wilde served 35 and 34 years, respectively, on the Daggett Conservation District Board. Special recognition was given to these Supervisors for their service to Daggett County at the District's monthly meeting on August 12th, 2020.

**Alex Radosevich** was first elected to the DCD Board in November 30, 1977. In his 35 year tenor, he served as a Supervisor, Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary. Alex seldom missed a meeting even though his travel time was 4 hours round trip. He always said he enjoyed the trip.

Alex spent 60 years on the Willow Creek ranch in Brown's Park, where he was born and raised. Besides Brown's Park, he operated ranches in Minnie's Gap and Sheep Creek Canyon. For many years he also hayed the meadows at Flaming Gorge Pines, the Fish & Game Property and the Trail Creek Ranch for winter feed.

Through the years he varied from raising yearlings to cow/calf operations and his operation saw the change from horse-drawn equipment and flood irrigating to high-tech tractors and advanced sprinkler systems.

Alex has served other Boards including the Farm Service Agency Committee, the Citizen of the Ashley Forest Committee, the Advisory Committee for the Rock Springs BLM office, and the Three Corners Landowner Wildlife Committee.

After retiring from the conservation district in 2012, Alex and his wife, Joan, are currently enjoying a quiet life in Roosevelt, Utah.

**Jon Wilde** was elected to the DCD Board on March 15, 1984. He served 34 years as a Supervisor and Vice-Chairman until he retired in June 2020.

Jon, a native of Croydon, Utah, graduated from high school in 1959. After graduating, he worked a short time for Mark Curtis Aviation building ram engines for space shuttles. Then, in the spring of 1960 Jon's dad, M.R. Wilde, offered him a job running the Lee Russell ranch south of McKinnon. It was a big change. Jon moved from a large sheep operation to running cattle at the foot of the Uintah Mountains where the winters are tough and it is crucial to put up enough hay during the short summer months to maintain a herd of cattle through the winter. He quickly adapted and with the support of his wife, Renae, established one of the most successful and beautiful ranches in the country.

Jon also served on the Daggett School Board for almost 20 years; he was active in the Utah Association of Conservation Districts for over 15 years; and, he served as President of the Interstate Irrigation & Reservoir Company for 12 years.

Jon still resides on this peaceful ranch he calls home.
