



## **November 3, 2020 General Election Information**

The General Election will be held on November 3, 2020. Preparations are under way for a Vote-By-Mail election and all voters are encouraged to check their voter registration at [www.vote.utah.gov](http://www.vote.utah.gov) or by contacting the Clerk's Office. If you are not currently registered and would like to get registered to vote you may do so at [www.vote.utah.gov](http://www.vote.utah.gov), by mailing an application to the Clerk's Office or visiting the Clerk's Office in person at 95 North 1st West in Manila, Utah by October 23, 2020. New voter registrations will be permitted during Early Voting and on Election Day, but voting in that instance will be by Provisional Ballot.

Ballots will be mailed out between October 13th and October 27th, so if you are not planning on receiving mail at your Daggett County location during that time, please contact the Clerk's Office ASAP to get an Alternate Address Request Form. We will have 6 days of Early Voting: October 22, 23, 26, 27, and 29, 2020 at the Daggett County Courthouse; 95 North 1st West; Manila, UT 84046 from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm and on Wednesday, October 28th at the Dutch John Conference Hall; 530 South Blvd; Dutch John, UT 84023 from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm. There will be Election Day Voting at the Courthouse on November 3, 2020 from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. Masks and social distancing are encouraged for those who choose to vote in person.

The County has been working with a company that will allow electronic voting for our military voters and other voters that are out of the country or disabled and need assistance. Please contact us at 435-784-3154 or [clerk@daggettcounty.org](mailto:clerk@daggettcounty.org) about this program or if you have any questions about voting in the 2020 General Election.

## **Tax Notices 2020**

Property Tax Notices will be going out around the 9th of October. If your mailing address has changed since last year's Tax Notices were sent, please notify us as soon as possible to ensure you receive your Tax Notice. If you have not received your notice by October 19th, please call the Treasurer's Office at 435-784-3154. Taxes received after November 30, 2020 are delinquent and will be charged a late fee unless postmarked on or before November 30, 2020. Payment Options include cash (do not send by mail), check, money order, and e-check, credit or debit card (A convenience fee will be charged for payment by credit card, debit card or e-check).

If your taxes are paid through your mortgage company, their name or a servicing agency will appear on the front of your Tax Notice. If there is not a company listed, and your taxes should be paid by your mortgage company, you will need to contact them directly.

# RECIPE OF THE MONTH

## SWEET POTATO SHEPHERD'S PIE

Here's what you will need:

- 2 pounds sweet potatoes, cut into thirds
- 4 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 pound ground meat (I used a combination of pork sausage and ground beef.)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 medium yellow onion, chopped
- 2 cups mushrooms, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 cup beef broth
- 1 1/2 cups crushed tomatoes
- 1 teaspoon dried rosemary
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 cup frozen corn
- 1 cup frozen peas and carrots
- Grated Parmesan and fresh rosemary for garnish (optional)



Serves about 8 people.

In a pot of cold salted water, bring the sweet potatoes to a boil. Cook for about 20 minutes or until tender; then drain. When cool enough to handle, remove and discard the skins.

In a large bowl, mash the sweet potatoes with butter, Parmesan cheese, and salt and pepper. Set aside.

Preheat your oven to 400 degrees F. Lightly coat six to eight individual casserole pans (or one large pan) with nonstick cooking spray.

In a large skillet, cook the ground meat over medium-high heat, breaking it up with a spoon. Cook until no longer pink. Transfer the meat to a colander and drain well. Wipe out your skillet with a paper towel.

In the same skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat. Add the onion and mushrooms and cook until tender (4-5 minutes). Add the garlic and cook for 2 more minutes. Stir in the broth, crushed tomatoes, rosemary, and Worcestershire sauce. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to medium and simmer until thickened. Then stir in the cooked meat, corn, peas and carrots. Add salt and pepper to taste. Cook 2 minutes.

Divide this mixture among the prepared baking dishes. Spread the top with the mashed sweet potatoes. Place dishes onto a large baking sheet.

Bake uncovered for 15-20 minutes or until the tops are lightly browned. Top with Parmesan cheese before serving.

Robert (Bob) Lee Stalnaker, 87, died peacefully at his home in West Valley City, UT surrounded by family. Bob was born July 5, 1933 in Plainville, Kansas to George Lee Stalnaker and Lillian Ann Novotny. He married Alta Joyce Tanner in 1957 at the Ramstein Airforce Base in Germany Rhineland while serving as a pilot for the U.S. Air Force. They recently celebrated their 63rd wedding anniversary. Their military journey continued with several stops throughout the United States including bases such as Luke Air Force Base (AFB) in Phoenix, AZ; Nellis AFB in Southern Nevada; McConnell AFB in Wichita KS; and March AFB (now Air Reserve Base) in Riverside, CA.

After leaving the Air Force, Bob returned to Kansas to start a cattle ranch with his best friend Leon (Sonny) Ross which operated for over 60 years. In 1961, the family relocated to Salt Lake City, Utah as Bob began a career as an air traffic controller with the Federal Aviation Administration. The next year they settled in Granger where they raised their four

children.

In 1964, Bob joined the National Guard unit which was later the reserves. Bob completed his Bachelor of Science degree at Westminster College and later purchased a C-182 Cessna and joined a “flying club.”

Bob was a very patriotic man and was very proud of the opportunity he had to serve and to fly a number of different aircraft including the Piper Cub, T-6, T-28, T-33, F-84, F-100, B-47 for the USAF. As a serviceman for the Army, he flew the Bell helicopter, Hiller helicopter, Huey helicopter, L-19 Birdog, U-8 Beaver, U-10, C-310 Cessna, and the U-8 Queenaire.

Bob is preceded in death by his parents; his infant son Douglas Lee; his sisters Betty Vogts (Melvin) and Shirley Stinemetz (Merlyn); and daughter-in-law Jeri Erickson Stalnaker.

Bob is survived by his wife, Joyce; children Keri Denise (Kelly) Graff, St George, UT, Mark Lee, Magna, UT, Scott Lee (Loralie), South Jordan, UT, and Shauna Joan (Scott) Anton, Temecula, CA; 14 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren; sisters Eva (Tom) Miller, Broken Arrow, OK, Gloria (Vernon) Chard, Hays, KS, Carolyn (Lawrence) Balderston, Tucson, AZ, Madge (Tom) Mock, Tucson, AZ, Dianne Conway, Manhattan KS, and Patty (Jim) Foltz, Las Vegas, NV; and brother Alan (Susan) Stalnaker, Taylorsville, UT.

Keith grew up in the Murray/Holladay areas and graduated from Granite High School in 1950. He joined the Army right out of high school and served in Germany during the Korean War.


