DAGGETT COUNTY TRAILS COMMITTEE MTG ONLINE

The Daggett County Trails Committee exists to improve and promote year-round, sustainable and connected multiple-use trails throughout Daggett County to enhance recreation opportunities for residents and visitors. The committee aims to establish and maintain relationships with public land entities and municipalities to further these goals.

We meet on the second Tuesday of each month at 6 pm. Currently we are meeting online via Google Meet because of COVID-19 concerns. VOLUNTEER CREW TACKLES CLEAN-UP ON LITTLE HOLE TRAIL RESTORATION PROJECT.

A crew of 14 volunteers organized by the Daggett County Trails Committee spent several hours assisting in the ongoing trail restoration project on the Little Hole National Recreation Trail in Green River Canyon on Friday, October 18. The team helped haul debris from a section of the damaged and dismantled boardwalk so United States Forest Service (USFS) employees could remove it from the trail for proper disposal. “We were fortunate to have a beautiful day,” said Christian Draper, who co-chairs the trails committee with his wife Valorie. “It hardly seemed like work, with the clear water and beautiful canyon all around us.”

This summer, the Daggett County Trails Committee partnered with the Forest Service and the Flaming Gorge Community Foundation to write a grant for funding from the Governor’s Office of Outdoor Recreation. A Utah Recreation Restoration Infrastructure grant was awarded to help fund the ongoing trail repair on the Little Hole Trail.

The section of the trail currently under repair is about 1.5 miles downstream from the dam. Because of the distance, Kevin Clegg, who manages the section of the Green River for the Forest Service, has been using a boat to haul the pieces of old boardwalk from the worksite to the boat ramp for transfer to a trailer for later disposal.

The volunteer crew spent about five hours shuttling the remains of the boardwalk about 150 yards from the demolition site to a location accessible by boat and unloading the boards.

“I thought it was very beautiful,” said volunteer Matthew Draper, 18, a senior and the son of the committee co-chairs. “And my ‘traps’ are sore,” he added, gesturing to his trapezius muscles. Matthew Draper said he thought the trail project was a worthy endeavor, indicating the scenic setting and the value of having a trail through the canyon.

The Little Hole Trail is the most popular and highly used trail in the Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area. Dam water discharge since the 1980’s has damaged portions of the trail, creating a safety hazard in some portions of the trail. Because of the high traffic on the trail, it is a high priority for the Forest Service to repair the damaged sections. Over the last few years, the agency has been able to make some improvements to parts of the trail, but about 2,500 feet of boardwalk sections still need to be replaced. The Little Hole Trail extends from the base of the Flaming Gorge Dam for approximately seven miles through the canyon to the Little Hole Recreation Area.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Butternut Squash and Black Bean Enchilada Skillet

A healthy vegetarian Mexican-inspired dinner -- butternut squash and black bean enchilada skillet.

Ready in less than 30 minutes!

Prep Time 5 minutes

Cook Time 20 minutes

Total Time 25 minutes

Servings 4 servings

Ingredients

2 teaspoons olive oil

3 cups 1/2-inch-diced, peeled butternut squash
(from about a 2-lb. squash)

salt and pepper, to season

1 medium yellow onion, diced

3 cloves of garlic minced

1/2 jalapeno, seeded and diced

1 teaspoon cumin

1 teaspoon chili powder

1 - 15 ounce can black beans, rinsed and drained

8 yellow corn tortillas, cut into thick strips

1-15 ounce can red enchilada sauce

1 cup reduced-fat colby jack or mexican cheese (or whatever you prefer), divided

cilantro and low-fat sour cream, for serving

Instructions

Heat olive oil over medium-high heat in large oven-proof skillet. Add onions, garlic, and jalapeno and cook 2-3 minutes until onions become translucent and garlic is fragrant. Add cubed squash, cumin and chili powder and season with salt and pepper. Cook, stirring occasionally, until the squash is slightly tender, 10-13 minutes. You want the squash to be fork tender, but not so tender that it starts to fall apart and become mush.

Next add the black beans, corn tortilla pieces, and can of enchilada sauce and stir to combine. Reduce heat to medium-low and sprinkle in 1/2 cup of cheese. Stir again and simmer for a few minutes. Turn on your oven broiler to high. Sprinkle an additional 1/2 cup of cheese over the top of the enchilada mixture and place in oven under broiler for 3-5 minutes until cheese melts and tortilla edges become a tiny golden brown. Remove from heat and serve immediately. Feel free to add in cilantro. Serve with sour cream, guacamole, or hot sauce! Enjoy!


