# RECIPE OF THE MONTH

## Ingredients

for 48 cookies

1 cup powdered sugar  
1 lb unsalted butter, room temperature  
2 large eggs  
2 large egg yolks  
2 teaspoons vanilla extract  
½ teaspoon kosher salt  
4 cups all purpose flour  
½ cup unsweetened shredded coconut  
2 tablespoons sparkling sugar

## DANISH BUTTER COOKIES

**A Christmas classic you'll love making at home, these crispy butter cookies come in different shapes, and textures including shredded coconut and a pretzel shaped topped with crunchy sparkling sugar.**



## Preparation

Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C). Line 6 baking sheets, or as many as you have, with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, cream the powdered sugar and butter with an electric hand mixer on medium-high speed until well combined and fluffy, 2–3 minutes.

Add the eggs, egg yolks, and vanilla. Beat until well combined and the batter is mostly smooth.

Gradually add the salt and flour, beating on low speed between each addition, until well combined, scraping down the sides of the bowl with a rubber spatula as needed.

Divide the dough evenly into 3 portions. Each portion of dough should be about 13.5 ounces.

Add the shredded coconut to 1 portion of dough and mix with your hands to combine. Portion the coconut dough into ½-ounce pieces and roll into balls. Place on 2 of the prepared baking sheets, spacing evenly. Using your fingers, gently press down on the tops of the dough rounds to create a flattened top. Transfer to the refrigerator if not baking immediately.

Transfer another portion of dough to a piping bag fitted with a large star piping tip. Pipe 2-inch (5 cm) circles of dough directly onto 2 of the prepared baking sheets, spacing evenly. Transfer to the refrigerator if not baking immediately.

Transfer the remaining portion of dough to a small piping bag fitted with a medium (¼-inch) round piping tip. Pipe 2-inch wide pretzel shapes directly onto the 2 remaining prepared baking sheets, spacing evenly. Sprinkle the pretzels with the sparkling sugar.

Working in batches, bake the cookies for 12–15 minutes, until just golden brown.

COVID-19 Present in Daggett County  
Sewer Monitoring, positive tests confirm COVID-19 transmission in  
Daggett County

Vernal, UT Nov. 23, 2020 – Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) Sewer Monitoring, is showing that Daggett County has COVID-19 present in the population of Manila and Dutch John. Monitoring sewers for COVID-19 gives an indication of trends regarding viral activity in the community.

In July, TriCounty Health Department (TCHD) put out a news release on detection of COVID-19 in the Daggett County area. The current detection is far greater than the detection in July. Dutch John Sewage monitoring jumped from 39 million gene copies (MGC) as reported in late July to 717 MGC on November 12 and 232 MGC on November 19. Manila, where the COVID-19 virus has remained relatively undetectable in the sewer system until now, is reporting 34 MGC on November 12 and 19 MGC on November 19.

As of Nov. 23, 2020, there are a total of three Daggett County confirmed cases of COVID-19, one of which has recovered. Data presented by DEQ coupled with the recent increase in reported infections all point to increased localized viral activity in Daggett County. As such, TCHD recommends that Daggett County residents adhere to the practices of limiting group sizes, practicing physical distancing with members not of your household, wearing a mask when in public and when physical distancing is not feasible, and practicing good hand hygiene such as washing or sanitizing hands.

“With limited access to healthcare, the actions of county residents is critical to protecting and preserving the health of each resident living in Daggett County,” TriCounty Health

Officer, Jordan Mathis emphasized. “Our purpose in sharing these trends is to allow residents to take preemptive action in slowing the spread of COVID-19.”

Testing is an important component of slowing the transmission of COVID-19. Testing not only helps individuals determine what measures they need to take to avoid further transmission to family, friends, and coworkers, but it also aids in determining the broader community risk. Testing offered through testutah.com is now open to anyone who desires a test, regardless of exposure or symptoms.



She grew up loving the beach while living in the country where her love of animals started young. She had a special spark about her that you could see a mile away. One rainy day while she was in high school she was walking to school and a handsome senior pulled his truck up next to her and said get in your getting soaked and there the love story of Ray and Barbi began. They soon were married and brought into the world their only child a daughter Nadine. They started their young life living in pacific beach California which became their back yard for Barbi to enjoy her love of the ocean, Ray to be able to fish and Nadine to learn swimming and surfing in the ocean.
