


UDOT TO RESURFACE S.R. 44 IN DAGGETT COUNTY

The Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) will resurface S.R. 44 from Greendale Junction to milepost 14. Anticipated project completion is end of September 2021.

Crews will remove existing asphalt and replace with a structural pavement that will help prolong the life of the roadway. New signage and guardrail are also included in this project.

Traffic Impacts: Alternating one-way traffic with flaggers and pilot car operations. Motorists can expect **delays of up to 15 minutes**. This project has a large trucking component to remove and replace the asphalt. Please be patient as we work to keep Utah moving! No lane closures will take place on holidays or weekends.

Fire Restriction Order

Due to current and forecasted weather conditions coupled with the dry conditions and extreme fire danger throughout Utah, the State Forester has determined that measures must be taken to prevent the ignition of forest and rangeland fires. Therefore, pursuant to Utah State Law, Section 65A-8-212, the following acts are prohibited in the areas described below until rescinded by the Utah State Forester:

1. Discharging or using any kind of fireworks

Area Description:

All state-owned lands -AND- all unincorporated private lands within the state of Utah.

The following persons are exempted from the above prohibitions:

1. Persons with a "Display Operator" license issued by the Utah State Fire Marshal's Office AND any local permits required where the display is to take place.

ORDER # UTCLO2105

Fire Restriction Order

Due to current and forecasted weather conditions coupled with the record dry vegetation conditions and extreme fire danger throughout Utah, the State Forester has determined that measures must be taken to prevent the ignition of forest and rangeland fires. Therefore, pursuant to Utah State Law, Section 65A-8-212, the following acts (also known as "Stage 1 Fire Restrictions") are prohibited in the areas described below until rescinded by the Utah State Forester:

1. No open fires of any kind except within established facilities in improved campgrounds or day-use areas on **public lands**. -OR- In permanently constructed fire pits at **permanent private dwellings** served by pressurized running water.
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle, trailer or building, a developed recreation site or while stopped in an area that is paved or free from dry vegetation.
3. Cutting, welding or grinding metal in areas of dry vegetation.
4. Operating a motorcycle, chainsaw, ATV, or other small internal combustion engine without an approved and working spark arrestor.

The following persons are exempted from the above prohibitions:

1. Persons with a permit or waiver issued by the Division, specifically authorizing a specified act at a specific location. A waiver does not relieve the permittee of liability if a fire does occur.
2. Any on-duty firefighter in the performance of an official duty.

Area Description: All state lands –AND- all unincorporated private lands within the state of Utah. This order does not affect private lands within incorporated towns or city limits.

Any of the above acts is a violation of state law and is punishable by up to 6 months in jail and a fine of up to \$1,000. These restrictions will be enforced by county law enforcement.

Effective Date: 12:01 a.m., on the 10th day of June, 2021





RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Chicken Cordon Bleu Pasta

You'll need:

- 3 cups uncooked penne pasta
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 1 package (8 oz) cream cheese, softened & cubed
- 1 1/2 cups shredded Swiss cheese, divided
- 1/2 tsp onion powder
- 1/2 tsp garlic salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 3 cups sliced cooked chicken breasts
- 3/4 crumbled cooked bacon
- 3/4 cup cubed, fully cooked ham
- 3 Tbsp dry bread crumbs




Directions:

- 1.) Preheat oven to 350°. Cook pasta according to package directions for al dente.
- 2.) Meanwhile, in a large saucepan, heat cream and cream cheese over medium heat until smooth, stirring occasionally. Stir in 1 cup Swiss cheese, onion powder, garlic salt and pepper until blended.
- 3.) Drain pasta; stir in chicken, bacon and ham. Add sauce; toss to coat. Transfer to a greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining cheese and the bread crumbs. Bake, uncovered, 18-22 minutes or until heated through.

Obituaries

Joseph Michael Rickards, beloved son, husband, father, grandfather, brother, uncle, and friend, passed away at age 77 on Friday, May 21, 2021 at Riverton Hospital in Riverton, Utah from heart failure. He was born on November 17, 1943 in Salt Lake City, Utah to Joseph Guiard Rickards and Mary Virginia Buehler. He married LeeAnne Clark on June 19, 1969 in the Salt Lake LDS Temple. His early boyhood days were spent in mining towns in Nevada, and at his grandfather Buehler's farm in Midway, Utah. He has many fond memories of boyhood adventures in the wide open desert hills of Nevada.

He later moved to Kearns, Utah and lettered in basketball and track while at Kearns Junior High. Following that, he was on the basketball team and graduated from Granger High School in 1961. He then graduated from BYU after serving a mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, in the North British Mission. He later obtained his Masters degree at BYU in Education.

He taught School at Brockbank Junior High, and Milwaukee Junior High in Oregon where he also coached basketball. Years later, he taught at John F. Kennedy Junior High in Kearns. In between the years of teaching, he also worked for the Utah State Board of Education. He has been the school principal in Manila Utah, and a school counselor in Garfield County School District. He has worked for Granite School District in Community Education at Cyprus High School. After retiring from education, he began a brief career in real estate, before being diagnosed with dementia. He suffered from dementia for 14 years prior to his death.

He and his wife have been married 51 years and have been blessed with 5 children and 8 grandchildren. The majority of their marriage was spent in South Jordan, Utah where they have lived for 33 years. They have many friends and loved ones nearby and LeeAnne is grateful for the support and love that has been expressed. Joe has served in 3 bishoprics, and as an Elder's Quorum President. He has a great love for family history and was a Family History Specialist for many years. He enjoyed studying the gospel, and has written 2 study guides for the Book of Mormon, and a Family Home Evening manual based on the Book of Mormon.

His favorite sports were basketball, fishing, golfing, and watching the Utah Jazz. He is survived by his wife LeeAnne, daughter Julie Anne Tanner (Mike), son David Rickards (Jessica), son Michael Rickards (Lexie), daughter Kelli Rickards, daughter Kasie Matson, and his grandchildren. He is also survived by his stepfather and mother, Dale and Mary Wheeler, sister Jill Zeller (Karl), sister Susan Fereday (Andre), and brother Todd Wheeler. He is preceded in death by his father, sister Sheila Greer, and brother Ken Rickards.



Ryan graduated from Cottonwood High School and went on to work as a mechanic.


