Recipe Of The Month

Chicken Parm Grilled Cheese

Ingredients

- 1tbsp. butter
- 2 slices white or sourdough bread
- 1 tbsp. plus 2 tsp. marinara
- 1 c. shredded mozzarella, divided
- 1/4 c. freshly grated parmesan, plus more for garnish
- 3 oz. fresh or frozen breaded chicken, cubed
- a few torn basil leaves
- Freshly ground black pepper



Heat broiler. Assemble sandwich: Spread butter on one side of each slice of bread. On the unbuttered side of one slice, spread 1 tablespoon marinara sauce, then top with 3/4 cup of mozzarella, Parmesan, chicken, and basil. Top with remaining slice of bread, buttered side up. In a large, oven-safe skillet over medium heat, cook sandwich until crispy, 5 minutes per side. Spread remaining 2 teaspoons marinara sauce on top of sandwich, then top with remaining 1/4 cup mozzarella. Broil until cheese is melty and golden. Sprinkle with additional Parmesan and pepper and serve.



Flaming Gorge Fire and EMS District

The district is looking to hire a part time district manager. Located in Daggett County, Utah, the district is looking for someone to help manage the day to day operations of the district. The desired applicant will be organized, self motivated, and willing to form cooperative relationships.

Duties

Responsible for the day to day business and affairs of the District, being subject to oversight by the Board, including but not limited to the following:

- Prepare and monitor billing for wildland interface, insurance claims, and others
- Oversee work done on wildland fire prevention agreement
- Prepare draft contracts
- Make necessary contacts with responsible officials and representatives of federal, state, county, other local units of government and agencies, and stakeholders
- Verify payroll
- Prepare draft annual budgets and monitor expenditures and income against approved budget
- Maintain logs of incidents the District is involved with
- Maintain logs of the District assets
- Develop and implement strategic plans for maintaining and improving the services of the District
- Review compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and regulations and identify any areas that need corrective action
- Attend all board meetings and report recent and planned District activities
- Prepare draft agendas and meeting packets and meeting minutes for board meetings and other meetings established by the Board
- Work with the Fire Chiefs and the EMS director to identify training needs and opportunities and track training done
- Coordinate discussions between the Board and the Fire Chiefs and the EMS Director
- Identify potential grant opportunities and complete grant applications
- Respond to and assist with fire and ems duties as needed and qualified to perform
- Other duties as assigned by the board

This position will be part time. Estimated workload 10 hours per week with room to grow as the district evolves. This position will require in person attendance at meetings but most work can be done remotely. Compensation \$20 per hour.



VOTER INFORMATION

Election Day Poll Hours: 7am-8pm

September 5, 2023
PRIMARY ELECTION
November 21, 2023
GENERAL ELECTION

How do I vote?

- 1 Present your valid form of ID to the poll worker and sign the official voting register.
- 2 The poll worker will give you a ballot.
- 3 Follow the instructions provided.
- 4 Double-check your selections.
- 5 Cast your ballot. Ask for assistance if needed.



What is valid identification?

Acceptable ID includes *valid*:

- Utah Driver's License
 - U.S. Passport
 - Tribal ID Card
 - Utah Concealed Carry Permit
- OR**
- **TWO** documents that have your name and provide evidence of residence (such as a utility bill and a bank statement)

The poll worker will provide you with a provisional ballot if you do not have valid ID, you are not found in the official voting register, or your right to vote is challenged. Complete the provisional ballot affidavit and then follow the instructions above to vote.

You may check the status of your provisional ballot after Election Day by visiting vote.utah.gov.

What are my rights?

As a voter, you have the right to:

- Have your ballot fairly and accurately counted
- Vote in any election scheduled in your jurisdiction
- Vote if you are in line before the polls close
- Cast your ballot in private without being interrupted, intimidated, coerced, or threatened
- Ask for help to cast your ballot
- Vote a ballot that is easy to understand and legible
- Replace your ballot if you made a mistake (if you did not already cast your ballot)
- Vote a provisional ballot if you are not allowed to vote on a regular ballot and be able to check the status of that provisional ballot

Voters with Disabilities

Polling locations must be accessible for all voters. Assistance to the hearing and/or visually impaired is provided by electronic voting machines. You may receive assistance from a poll worker or an individual of your choice; however, an employer, union representative, or candidate may not assist you.

Prohibitions

It is against the law to:

- Receive money or anything of value to vote, change your vote, or not vote
- Vote if you are ineligible to vote
- Impersonate another voter or vote more than once
- Alter any ballot after it has been cast
- Interfere with election officials or other voters
- Intentionally damage, modify, steal, tamper with, or destroy a voting device or equipment
- Deface, remove, or destroy ballots or other election materials
- Electioneer within 150 feet of this polling location

Recreate Responsibly on Utah Public Lands

With the increase in recreation throughout the summer months, land managers have observed increased misuse of public lands. Two issues that continue to plague Utah during this uptick in visitation are litter and human-caused fires (especially abandoned campfires). To help us better serve the public and conserve the land, we remind visitors to do their part to recreate responsibly.

Kyle Yurkovich, Fire Prevention Specialist with the US Forest Service, states “Many of our employees patrolling across Utah are finding a huge increase in abandoned campfires and human-caused fires from negligent behavior of forest visitors. The tall grasses and weeds are deceptively green and are more flammable than they look. This gives a false sense of security when leaving a campsite or recreating on public land.”

Fire Prevention

Utah experienced an unprecedented snowpack this winter, leading to a surge in the growth of fine fuels like grasses and shrubs. With hotter temperatures forecasted in the coming weeks, these fuels become prone to drying out rapidly, which poses a serious fire hazard. Even a simple spark can quickly spiral out of control and turn into a dangerous wildfire, especially when coupled with strong winds. Along with this potential fire threat, land managers have experienced growing numbers of abandoned campfires, misuse of equipment, improper safety measures when target shooting, and the use of illegal items on public lands.

Tips to eliminate human-caused wildfires:

- Know Before You Go: Check local fire restrictions before you recreate. Be aware of current weather and fuel conditions. Red Flag Warnings can contribute to extreme rapid fire growth.
- Campfires: Ensure you have a shovel and water source nearby. Keep fires at a manageable size. Never leave a fire unattended. Use the “Drown, Stir, Feel, and Repeat” method to extinguish campfires.
- Equipment: Be mindful of your surroundings. Take proper maintenance measures. Never park on or drive over dry vegetation. Ensure trailer chains don’t drag and OHVs have spark arresters.
- Target shooting: Avoid shooting rocks, metal, or pressurized containers. Shoot away from dry vegetation. Exploding targets, tracer ammunition, and fireworks are NEVER allowed on public lands.

Litter and Vandalism

Improper waste disposal in outdoor spaces can have severe consequences, so cleaning up after yourself is crucial. Unfortunately, this summer, there has been increased vandalism and garbage left at popular locations such as campsites, campgrounds, trailheads, boat ramps, and parking lots in Utah’s public lands. This causes additional issues and results in taxpayers’ money being spent on cleanup and repairs. Our public lands and waterways are essential sources of our drinking water, and irresponsible actions like these can contaminate them. Additionally, trash can take a long time to break down, is harmful to wildlife, and is unsightly to other visitors. It is the users’ responsibility to clean up before they leave.


