Commissioner Corner

Keeping you Informed

We would like to update everyone on the status of the grants the county has received this year. We received several and now the hard part begins. Getting them implemented!!

Utah Outdoor Recreation grant \$200,000, was awarded for the Shooting Complex, completion date of summer of 2025 or sooner. This will include a pistol range, 300 yard rifle range, two trap shooting houses, archery range, 3D archery trail, and an area for axe and knife throwing. The range will be open to the public during daylight hours. The county property set aside for the range has been surveyed and shooting areas staked out. Initial construction and excavation will start the second week of November 2023.

In October talks began with the Forest Service for the Ski Resort. An updated feasibility plan and a 10% master plan in the form of a pre-application has been submitted. The goal would be to submit the formal application late in January. Slow but moving forward on this huge project.

The Daggett County Museum Complex received a small grant from the Utah Arts and Museum Board totaling \$3,750.00 to do repairs in the School Marm building. The inside ceiling has deteriorated substantially. This will be completed before May of 2024.

The Bike/Walking path (1.6 million UDOT grant) is moving forward. Civco Engineering has surveyed and begun work on the layout of the path. A Public Meeting was held on October 19th going over the proposed plans. Completion is expected to be in 2024.

The Rural County Opportunity Grant for \$200,000.00 was awarded this month for FY23 & FY24. This funding will go towards completing the Pickleball/Basketball Court. A construction firm has been awarded the project and will be completed in the late spring of 2024. (Weather permitting) Also, additional funds have been designated for the Rodeo grounds. Additional new seating will be provided. Intentions are to have other events in the stadium along with the rodeos. This will also be finished in 2024.

2023 Municipal General Election Notice

November 21, 2023 is Election Day for the 2023 Municipal General Election. In Person Election Day Voting will be held on Tuesday, November 21, 2023 at the Vote Center at the Daggett County Courthouse (95 North 1st West; Manila, Utah) from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. You must bring ID (and proof of residency if you have recently moved). Ballots will be mailed out by November 6, 2023. You may sign up for text, email, or phone call notification for the status of your mailed ballot at: <https://ballottrax.utah.gov/voter/> .

If you will be out of town after that time, contact us at the number below for an Alternate Address Form. If you cannot read or mark a ballot, we can provide assistance or the use of a ballot marking device with accessible features (e.g.: audio ballot, touch screen, large print, high contrast), so please contact the Clerk's Office as outlined below. If you have any questions, do not receive a ballot or feel you have the wrong ballot, please contact the Daggett County Clerk's Office at 435-784-3154, clerk@daggettcounty.org or by mail at PO Box 400; Manila, UT 84046. Any changes to the information in this notice can be found on the County website: www.daggettcounty.org/elections The State Elections website is: <https://vote.utah.gov/> .

Voters must be of legal voting age, citizens of the United States, and reside in the precincts within the town boundaries of Manila and Dutch John.

VOTER REGISTRATION DEADLINE

The Registration Deadline is **NOVEMBER 13TH AT 5:00 PM**. If you miss this deadline please bring your id and proof of residency and vote provisionally during Early Voting or Election Day.

EARLY VOTING

Early Voting will take place at the Daggett County Courthouse (95 North 1st West; Manila, Utah) on Monday, November 13, Wednesday, November 15 and Friday, November 17, 2023 from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm for both municipalities. Early Voting in Dutch John will be held Thursday, November 16th, 2023 at the Conference Hall (530 South Blvd.; Dutch John, Utah) from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm and is also available for residents of both municipalities.

DROP BOXES

Ballot Drop Boxes are located at the Conference Hall in Dutch John (530 South Blvd.; Dutch John, Utah) and the County Courthouse in Manila (95 North 1st West; Manila, Utah) and are available 24-7. Drop Boxes are under video surveillance. An Additional Drop Box is available from 9 am to 5 pm in the Clerk's Office at the Courthouse. All Drop boxes will close at 8:00 pm on Election Day.

VOTE BY MAIL

Ballots MUST be Postmarked by the day before Election Day (November 20th) to be counted.

LOGIC AND ACCURACY TESTING

Public Testing of the Voting Equipment for logic and accuracy will be performed Thursday, November 2, 2023 at the Daggett County Clerk's Office at 2:00 pm.

INGREDIENTS

2 cups all-purpose flour (about 8 1/2 ounces)

2 tablespoons light brown sugar

2 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt

1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder

1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda

3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon, or more to taste

1/8 teaspoon ground cloves, or more to taste

2 1/4 cups buttermilk

1/2 cup leftover mashed sweet potatoes

2 large eggs

1 1/2 teaspoons grated orange zest

1/2 cup toasted walnuts, chopped

Unsalted butter, for greasing griddle and serving

1/2 cup granola

Pure maple syrup, for serving



DIRECTIONS

Stir together flour, brown sugar, salt, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, and cloves in a medium bowl. Whisk together buttermilk, sweet potatoes, eggs, and orange zest in a large bowl. Stir in flour mixture until dry ingredients are just incorporated. Stir in walnuts. Let batter stand at room temperature 15 minutes.

Heat an electric griddle to 350°F, or heat a large stainless steel skillet over medium-low; grease with butter. Using a 2 3/4-inch scoop and working in 3 batches, spoon about 1/2 cup batter per pancake onto hot griddle. Cook until tops are covered in bubbles and sides are set, 2 to 3 minutes. Flip and cook until set and cooked through, 2 to 3 minutes. Wipe griddle clean between batches.

To serve, top pancakes with butter. Sprinkle evenly with granola, and drizzle with maple syrup.

School District Updates

DAGGETT SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The Daggett School District held a Truth and Taxation Hearing in Manila on August 8th at 6PM, followed by a regularly scheduled Board meeting. During the hearing Superintendent Northcott explained while a portion of the district's tax plan proposed an increase, another portion proposed an equal decrease, resulting in a net change of zero. What this means is that any changes in your tax bill would be the result of a change in property valuations and/or other tax rate changes implemented by other governmental entities. The specifics of the district's tax plan changes can be found on the district's website.

Our regularly scheduled Board meeting highlights of August 8th are noted below:

- The Board approved the district's 2023-2024 tax rates and final FY2024 budget.
- The District presented plans to implement a new website that is expected to be much more user friendly, improve communications and provide opportunities for back and forth dialog. This change is expected to be up and running by the beginning of school.
- The Board has approved full time kindergarten and an expanded morning pre-school/pre-kindergarten. This will be a change from last year's ½ morning extended day kindergarten and shorter afternoon pre-school/pre-kindergarten. These programs are set to begin this year.
- The District's Day Care Program is ready to go and will start at the beginning of the school year.
- The District presented some key organizational changes for this next school year which are displayed in the following chart:

- The Board approved an increase for school meals of 25 cents per meal. School breakfasts are now \$2.30 for elementary students and \$2.40 for high school students. Lunches are \$2.80 for elementary students and \$3.05 for high school students. There is no change for those students eligible for free or reduced-price meals.
- The District reported that they have purchased a new bus. This occurs about every four years. Delivery is set for January 2024.
- The Board also approved the district's most recent Surplus and Destroy lists. Items on these lists will be available for public sale or will be destroyed. Contact Lynette Asay at the District Office (435-784-3174 Ex 100) with any questions.

BACK TO SCHOOL

PETROGLYPHS

On Wednesday, August 30th, the Manila High School sophomore history class set out on a field trip to South Valley to explore our region's indigenous people. With the help of Bryan Smith, students were able to find and identify different petroglyphs from the Neolithic age and more recent Shoshone tribes. The area boasted an abundant collection of ancient history, some of which included a hunting scene, a bear, a herd of elk, a horned snake, and a shaman. The oldest petroglyph, dating back over 10,000 years, featured a woolly mammoth and multiple anthropomorphs. Even though the journey was a little hard, the petroglyphs were worth it, and the students enjoyed being outside in the sunshine.

Before the first bell of the new school year even rang, the Lady Mustangs volleyball team was putting hours in preparing for the season that kicked off on August 15th. Throughout the week, students and staff filled them with donations for two reasons: the first and most important one was to help the people of Maui, the second, and for the students just as important, to see the top two fund-generating teachers participate in the ice bucket challenge. Additionally, before the home game against Wendover, a tailgate BBQ was held for the athletes and community. Baked goods were also auctioned off during the JV and Varsity games. Overall, Manila High School was able to donate a total of \$1480.20.
