

Recipe Of The Month

Mashed Potato au Gratin



DIRECTIONS

Preheat the oven to 450 degrees F (230 degrees C). Butter a 13x9-inch baking dish.

For the mashed potato, add quartered russet potatoes to a pot with 3 tablespoons salt and enough water to cover by 2 inches. Bring to a boil over high heat; reduce heat to medium and simmer until tender when pierced with a sharp knife, but not falling apart, 15 to 20 minutes. Drain very well.

Return potatoes to the pot, and mash until almost smooth. Add butter, salt, and cayenne. Mash until smooth.

Add milk and the 4 ounces shredded cheese, and mash and mix until evenly combined. Spread evenly into the prepared baking dish, and smooth the top. Season the top with salt and freshly ground black pepper.

For the au gratin potato layer, slice each half potato into 1/8-inch slices.

Fan the potato out slightly at an angle, and place on top of mashed potatoes. Repeat with remaining potato halves to cover the surface, creating 4 rows across by 2 potato halves long, using 8 halves total. Depending on the size of potato and dish, you may have to adjust the layout to cover.

Generously salt sliced potatoes, and brush generously with melted butter. Scatter the 2 ounces shredded cheese on top, and finish with grated Parmigiano-Reggiano. Bake in the preheated oven until sliced potatoes on top are tender when pierced with a knife, about 1 hour. ~www.allrecipes.com


Mashed Potato Base:

6 large russet potatoes, peeled and quartered
3 tablespoons kosher salt
1/2 cup cold unsalted butter, cut in pieces
salt to taste
1 pinch cayenne
3/4 cup milk
4 ounces Comte, Gruyere, or Cheddar cheese, shredded

Au Gratin Potato Topping:

4 large russet potatoes, peeled and halved
2 teaspoons kosher salt
freshly ground black pepper to taste
2 tablespoons melted butter
2 ounces Comte cheese, Gruyere cheese, or Cheddar cheese, shredded
1/2 cup grated Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese

VOLLEYBALL

School District Updates

DAGGETT SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The Daggett School District Board met on November 14th in Manila. One of the highlights of this meeting was a presentation by Principal Browning regarding junior high and high school student accomplishments during the first quarter of this school year. For the first time ever there were no failed classes. Additionally, 77 of 119 students made the honor roll (GPA of 3.5 or better), and of those 77, 48 made the high honor roll (GPA of 3.75 or better). This is a dramatic increase over past 1st quarter achievements. Way to go Manila HS students and good job Manila HS teachers and administrators!

The board approved the 2025-26 school year calendar. School is scheduled to start on Wednesday, August 13, 2025, and end on Thursday, May 21, 2026. In 2025, students will have a 17-day Christmas break and a 4-day spring break since Christmas falls on a Thursday.

The board also agreed to consider changes to the 2024-25 school year calendar at their next scheduled board meeting on December 12th.

School Board members discussed attendance at the Utah School Board Association convention on January 4-6, 2024 in Salt Lake City. Most board members will be attending this convention.

The board also made final plans for the Daggett School District Christmas Social on December 12th, 6:30 PM at the Manila Elementary School. All district teachers, staff members, administrators and coaches, along with their spouses, are invited.





Home Energy Assistance Target (HEAT) Program

Do you need help paying your home energy and water bills? The HEAT program provides energy assistance to low income households throughout the state of Utah. Assistance is on a one time basis and is subject to a qualifying process. You must reapply each program year (October 1st to September 30th). See details below for qualifying:

Eligibility Requirements for Energy Assistance/WATER Assistance:

- The total household income is at or below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level.
- The household is responsible for paying home energy costs.
- The household contains at least one US citizen or qualified non-citizen

Necessary Documentation

- A copy of your electrical/power, heat (Dominion, Propane, etc.) and water utility bills
- Proof of **ALL** income received by **all** household members in the month prior to the month of your application
- Proof of any eligible medical expenses, child support and alimony any member of the home paid in the month prior to the month of your application
- Proof of disability, if applicable
- Additional documentation, if required
- Fill out and complete an application

The Income levels are listed in the Federal Poverty Level chart below. We are required to use Gross amounts, but do allow for a 20% working wages income disregard. Any Medical paid out of pocket in the eligibility month can be used as a deduction. This includes but is not limited to: health insurance, copays, prescriptions, dental, eye care, etc. Child support or alimony paid out of pocket it also an allowable deduction. Receipts must be provided.
