

School District Update



The Daggett School District Board was able to perform one of its most enjoyable duties at the Manila High School graduation on May 23rd; helping to present the Class of 2024 their graduation certificates and shake the hands of all 21 Manila HS graduates. This year's 21 graduates made up the biggest class in 25 years! Shanelle Kelsch and Kate Bambrough delivered great graduation speeches as the valedictorian and salutatorian. Bubba O'Neil was the graduation speaker from Evanston, Wyoming who also did a great job. Go Mustangs! The Daggett School Board met on May 14th in Manila. Board members attending were Chelsey Lail, Sarah Wilson, Rob Gahley and Ross Catron. Charles Card attended electronically. This meeting functioned as the second and last hearing for the adoption of 2024-25 school curriculum. The curriculum that was adopted is available to review on the district's website. This meeting also functioned as the first of two budget hearings for the 2024-25 school year. The second and final budget hearing will be on June 11th in Manila, beginning at 6:00 PM. Everyone is welcome to attend this hearing. The board received a report from Shanelle Kelsch, Anna Guymon and Thomas Draper on their trip to Washington D.C. They were able to meet with some of Utah's congressional delegation and received a hands-on view of our nation's capital. They also interacted with a number of other students and had a terrific time! The board approved numerous items (mostly computer equipment) as surplus to the district's needs. These items are listed on the district's website and are available for purchase. Please contact Lynette Asay at 435-784-3174 if you are interested in these items. The board also approved each school's Trustland and Teacher and Student Success Plans for 2024-2025. These plans can be reviewed on the district's website. The board invites each of you to view Superintendent Northcott's podcasts which are broadcast twice a month and are available to review on the district's website. Please keep the date of August 27, 2024 open so that you can attend the School Board's Town Meeting. We expect to be sharing a lot of information and doing a lot of listening. We look forward to your participation. Your comments from this meeting will help to develop the district's strategic plan. More details to come. Recipe Of The Month

Chocolate Peanut Butter Dream Bars

Directions

Preheat oven to 350°. In a large bowl, finely crush 24 of the cookies; stir in melted butter. Press onto the bottom of an ungreased 9-in. square baking pan. Bake until lightly browned, about 10 minutes. Cool completely.

In a small bowl, whisk pudding mix and milk until smooth; spread over cooled crust. In another small bowl, beat cream cheese, powdered sugar and peanut butter. Fold in 1 cup whipped topping. Spoon cream cheese mixture over pudding; gently spread to cover pudding. Spread remaining whipped topping over cream cheese layer. Cover and refrigerate for at least 2 hours. Coarsely crush remaining 8 cookies. Sprinkle crushed cookies and chips over whipped topping before serving.









MacArthur (Art) Ylincheta, husband, father, grandfather, great grandfather, cowboy, contractor, and all-around good guy passed away in Vernal, Utah on April 17, 2024. Art was born on May 1st, 1942, in Rock Springs, Wyoming to John Sr. and Aniceta Ylincheta of Manila, Utah. Art was the youngest of four children with one older brother (John Jr.) and two older sisters (Blanche & Dolores).

Art graduated from Manila High School in 1960 where he ran track and played basketball. He then went on to Utah State University where he studied agriculture. While attending High School and College, rodeo became his hobby

where he was a bullfighter, bull rider, steer wrestler, bareback rider, and roper. He was a member of the RCA and PRCA (Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association). Art then came back to Manila to work on the family ranch, but he discovered his career passion – excavation & grading construction while working on Flaming Gorge Dam in 1962. Art & Jill also started Ranch Outfitters in 1989 selling livestock handling equipment in the intermountain area.

Art devoted countless hours of service during his life. While in Manila, he was a member of the Lions Club and was on the Sheep Creek Irrigation Company board. He was instrumental lobbying with the Governor to get approval for the construction of Long Park Reservoir. In Vernal, he was a member of the Elks Lodge where he organized the first NCHA Cow Cutting event in Vernal. He was also on the Western Park board during the planning and construction of the Western Park Facility. He was always passionate about rodeo and horses. He was a 4-H leader for many years where he shared his passion for horses with countless kids in the community. He was also on the Dinosaur Roundup Rodeo Committee for many years and served as President of the committee in 1988. Art spent countless hours hauling his kids and horses across the state to horse shows and rodeos. He also traveled with the Uintah Youth Orchestra on their tours around the West.
