Search and Rescue  
Flaming Gorge Reservoir, Swim Beach  
Daggett County, Utah

On day three of the search on Flaming Gorge, Swim Beach area of Daggett County, I can report that the missing paddle boarder has been recovered. Search crews began scaling back efforts Sunday due to hazardous weather conditions. On Monday the search resumed with boats and divers. After Monday, the decision was made to scale back recovery efforts. At approximately 1120 hours this morning, recovery crews found the missing woman.

The drowning victims have been identified as 66-year-old Ramiza Cejvan and her daughter, 44-year-old Emina Cejvan, both of Sandy Utah.

Again, Sheriff Erik Bailey and the entire search team extend their condolences to the family during their grief.



## Perfect Potato Salad



### Ingredients

5 lb. russet potatoes (about 8 medium potatoes)

1 1/2 c. real mayonnaise (NOT Miracle Whip), plus more as needed

4 Tbsp. mustard (yellow, dijon, or a mixture of both), plus more as needed

5 green onions, sliced up to the darkest green part

1 tsp. kosher salt, plus more to taste

1/2 tsp. black pepper

1/2 tsp. paprika (optional)

8 small sweet pickles, chopped (may use dill if that's more up your alley)

4 hard-boiled eggs, roughly chopped

4 slices bacon, fried and crumbled

### Directions

- 1 | Cut the potatoes in halves or thirds, then boil until fork tender. Drain. Mash the potatoes or run them through a ricer or food mill to make them extra fluffy.
- 2 | In a large bowl, fold the potatoes together with the mayonnaise, mustard, green onion, salt, pepper, and other seasonings you like, such as paprika. Fold in the pickles, eggs, and bacon, then taste for seasonings, adding more salt, mustard, or mayonnaise as needed. You may also splash in juice from the pickle jar if salad needs a little moisture.



## **SOCIAL SECURITY IN PLAIN LANGUAGE**

The terms and acronyms people use when they talk about Social Security can be a little confusing. Knowing where to find easy-to-understand definitions can be very helpful. We're here to provide resources to help you understand much of what you need to know about Social Security and our terminology. If there's a technical term or acronym that you don't know or understand, you can easily find the meaning in our online glossary at [www.ssa.gov/agency/glossary](http://www.ssa.gov/agency/glossary). We strive to explain our programs and benefits using plain language. In fact, the Plain Writing Act of 2010 requires federal agencies like the Social Security Administration to communicate in a way the public can understand. This can be challenging when talking about complicated programs like Social Security, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), and Medicare. That's why the glossary is helpful. If you're nearing retirement, you may want to know the meaning of PIA (primary insurance amount), FRA (full retirement age), and DRCs (delayed retirement credits). These terms all relate to your benefit amount — based on when you decide to take your Social Security. If you start receiving your retirement benefit at FRA, you'll receive the full PIA (amount payable for a retired worker who starts benefits at full retirement age). So, FRA is an age and PIA is an amount. What about DRCs? Delayed retirement credits are the incremental increases added to your PIA if you delay taking retirement benefits beyond your FRA. If you wait to begin benefits beyond FRA — say, at age 68 — your benefit increases for each month you delay up until you reach age 70. Once you receive benefits, you typically get an annual COLA (Cost-of-Living Adjustment) that increases your monthly benefit most years. Learning our terminology can deepen your understanding of how Social Security works for you and your family. Please share this information with your loved ones.

## Robert Bobek



Family memorial service for Robert E. “Bob” Bobek, 90, of Valentine, formerly of Pierce, will take place at a later date in Valentine, NV. Stonacek Funeral Chapel is in charge of the arrangements. Robert Bobek died Tuesday, May 21, 2024, at the Stanton Health Center in Stanton. Bob was born Feb. 27, 1934, in Pierce, NV to William and Mildred Bobek. He had one older brother, Billy Bobek. In high school he excelled in all his classes and enjoyed working with horses, playing basketball and participating and placing in numerous track and field events. Bob was in the U.S. Army from 1953-1956. During that time, he served in Newfoundland, and his love of horses led him to work with the mule packs. While in the military, he earned a brown belt in Judo. On June 1, 1957, Bob and Glenda (Potter) were married in Linwood, Utah, (a little town now buried under the waters of the Flaming Gorge Dam). Their first baby was a little girl, Tana, born in June 1959. In May 1960, their second daughter, Kathryn, arrived. Bob and his family joined and became active members of the Episcopal Church. Bob had a deep love for his family, and his faith was important to him, so he made sure they attended church services every Sunday and listened to every Billy Graham program on TV. After graduating from Utah State University in Logan, Utah, Bob became a forest ranger, landing him and his new spouse in the primitive areas of Idaho (where they spent their honeymoon), accessible only by mule packs. He became district ranger of the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest in Austin, Nevada. Bob served in the U.S. Forest Service for 14 years. He became the secretary of Board of Education Lands and Funds at the Nebraska state capitol in Lincoln. He worked for Metropolitan Life Insurance as a land appraiser. Wanting to find a permanent place to settle his family, he moved to Valentine and purchased a local ice cream shop, The Dairy Sweet. He became interested in law enforcement and sold the business to work as a police officer for the city and eventually became chief deputy for the Cherry County Sheriff’s Department in Valentine. In 1988, he was awarded Officer of the Year. After 25 years in law enforcement, Bob retired in 2004. Bob and his horse, Smutty, participated in many rodeo (cutting and calf-roping) events. He was an avid gun and knife collector and loved hunting with Tar, his black Labrador Retriever that he trained, and target shooting, spending many hours in the basement reloading his own ammo to get that perfect shot.
