Election Update



General Election - November 5, 2024

This year's General Election including the Presidential Election is scheduled for November 5, 2024. The Polls will be open for in-person voting from 7 am to 8 pm. Voters may also vote early in the Clerk's Office at the Daggett County Courthouse (95 North 1st West, Manila) from 9 am to 5 pm on Friday, October 25th; Monday, October 28th; Wednesday, October 30th; Thursday October 31st and Friday, November 1st, 2024. We will have voting machines at the Dutch John Conference Hall (530 South Blvd., Dutch John) on Tuesday, October 29, 2024 from 3 pm to 7 pm for Early Voting in Dutch John. **Mail-in ballots must be postmarked by November 4, 2024 to be counted.** Due to issues with postmarks we encourage you to submit your ballots as early as possible and if near the date of the 4th to get it postmarked by hand. There is a drop box at the Conference Hall in Dutch John and the Courthouse in Manila that are available 24/7 and are under video surveillance. These will be open until 8 pm on Election Day. Lastly, there is a ballot box in the Clerk's Office that will be available from 9 am to 5 pm on Weekdays and 7 am to 8 pm on Election Day.

October 25, 2024 is the deadline to register to Vote, but unregistered voters can vote provisionally during Early Vote and on Election Day. Please bring proof of residency in Daggett County and Identification.

Ballots will be mailed to active, registered voters that did not request to Vote In Person on October 15, 2024. If you have not received your ballot by October 23, 2024, please contact the Clerk's office at 435-784-3154 or clerk@daggettcounty.org. If you have any questions about the election please contact us. The Clerk's office will be conducting a Logic and Accuracy test on October 25, 2024 at 1:00 pm. The Public is invited to attend and see how the machines process and tabulate the test ballots. Please check the County's website at www.daggettcounty.org/elections for additional information and election updates. Community Spotlight

Legendary angler gives plenty of reasons to protect the 'best' river in the world

Fly fishing is Emmett Heath's heaven and the Green River is his god. Heath got hooked on angling as a young teen while fishing with his father in Utah. It became more than a past-time or a sport and instead a state of being where he said he feels at "one with nature." So it's not too surprising he ended up making a living from it and becoming widely known in the fly fishing community as Dean of the Green. He earned that title for his encyclopedic knowledge of the river - its water flows, the rocks and insects, and his keen ability to read the river and find fish in this tributary of the Colorado River. Although he has a different take on which river is feeding the other one. Heath lives in Dutch John, a town in Daggett County with a summertime population of about 200 people, with river guides making up about half of them. "The main thing that fishing does is put you where you like most, in the mountains and the rivers. That's what you love about it. You always want to be along the river, especially a guide," said Heath. Working for Western Rivers Flyfisher, Heath became one of the first registered fly fishing guides on the Green River in 1986 and in 2016 after years of hard work he was inducted into the Utah Fly Fishing Hall of Fame. He calls the Green River his "living friend" and it introduced him to a lot of other friends including celebrities such as Kevin Costner, Heather Thomas, Tiger Woods, Woody Harelson, and Jaimi Lee Curtis.

"Because it's literally the best river in the world. The insects, the chemical nutrients. It's perfect," said Heath.

Recipe Of The Month

Smoky Pumpkin Deviled Eggs

12 Hard-cooked eggs	2 tsp. prepared horseradish
5 Tbsp. canned pure pumpkin	1 tsp. smoked paprika
3Tbsp. mayonnaise	Salt and freshly ground black pepper
1 Tbsp. Dijon mustard	6 small cornichons



Directions

1. Peel eggs and cut in half lengthwise. Remove yolks and set whites aside.
2. Process yolks, pumpkin, mayonnaise, mustard, horseradish, and paprika in a food processor until smooth, about 30 seconds. Season with salt and pepper.
3. Transfer yolk mixture to a large zip-top bag. Cut a 3/4-inch hole in one corner of bag. Pipe filling into well of each egg white. Smooth yolk mixture with a damp finger. Make ridges on yolks with a fork.
4. Cut cornichon in half lengthwise, then crosswise, creating 24 pieces. Place 1 cornichon at one end of each yolk, creating a stem. Cover with a damp paper towel and chill up to 2 hours (if desired).

The Board also heard from UBTech President Aaron Weight who first complimented our students and then presented some of the programs they sponsor that can benefit our students, and for that matter anyone in Daggett County. 





Jerry had a lifelong passion for cars, he was a talented body and repair man and restored many vehicles throughout his life. His vehicles were featured in several magazines in the 1970’s. He was a member of the Staggs Car Club Ogden for many years. He admired a stylish wristwatch and had a watch for every day of the week and then some. He became an avid reader in his retirement and appreciated the weight and feel of a hardback book. He moved to St. George, Utah, in 2005 where he established his own business “The Handy Man” he operated his business successfully for over a decade. Jerry loved the beauty and warmth of Southern Utah and couldn’t imagine living anywhere else. He loved all animals and had a soft spot for any animal in trouble or threatened. He contributed to several animal rescue foundations. Jerry had several dogs throughout his life and loved them all. He was especially fond of his last dog Buck. Buckey Boy was his constant companion over the last few years. Jerry was a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Jerry is survived by his children, Staci Gallegos (Ron) Stimson, Brad Faulkner, and Monique Johnson; grandchildren, Sabrina Gallegos, Coby Gallegos, Brittney Lloyd, Brayden Lloyd, and Haileigh Johnson; and several great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his father, Arnold Faulkner; mother, Verna Faulkner; and brother, Brent Faulkner A graveside service was held Friday, August 9, 2024, at 11 a.m. at the Ben Lomond Cemetery, North Ogden.

Allowee Heiner Briggs passed away in Mapleton, Utah, on September 12, 2024. Allowee was born July 16, 1923 in Morgan, Utah to Henry Heiner and Margaret Robison Heiner.
