Community Spotlight

Sam Dupaix



Sam Dupaix, a student from the small town of Manila, Utah, is making waves in the world of drone technology thanks to Utah State University Eastern's hands-on Drone Certification Program. Currently pursuing an additional certificate in additive manufacturing, Sam said this cutting-edge program has shaped his educational and career goals. Sam, like many others, was attracted to the small-town feel of the USU Eastern campus, which mirrored the close-knit community he grew up in. "Where I grew up in a small town, this kept that small-town vibe, but still big enough to have a nice campus," he said. After a campus tour, he was sold on the program and the school. Initially hesitant about further education after high school, Sam recognized the importance of having qualifications in today's job market. "I didn't want to do more school, but I knew I needed something to get a job," he said. "The drone certificate was perfect because it's a one-year program with all drone-focused classes." The prospect of jumping into a high-demand industry with promising job prospects sealed the deal. The unique appeal of USU Eastern's Drone Certification Program lies in its practical, hands-on approach. Students aren't just learning to fly drones; they're also building, designing, crashing and repairing them. "I love getting hands-on, and the fact that you're building and designing drones was what really caught my attention," Sam said. The program's immersive nature kept him engaged, and the ability to make mistakes and learn from them was

a valuable part of his journey. Sam's certification didn't just stay in the classroom. He took on a role as a lab tech, mentoring the next generation of students. He also worked on exciting projects, including flying the large Matrice 600 drone with methane sensors and weather stations as part of a collaboration with the Vernal campus. "Being able to teach the next group and work on advanced projects has been a great opportunity," he said. One of Sam's most surprising experiences was during the "Drones for Hire" class, where students participate in real-world internships. Sam worked with Robotics Skies, a drone maintenance company, and found himself involved in high-level projects. "I wasn't expecting that; even some of the people I knew hadn't seen the things I got to see," he said, describing it as both a rewarding and eye-opening experience. The versatility of the drone certification program is something Sam is eager to highlight. "I had classmates using drones for agriculture, mosquito abatement, search and rescue, and even construction," he said. The possibilities in fields like law enforcement, construction, agriculture and media are vast. Sam sees drones being applied in many innovative ways, including search and rescue and even data collection for environmental studies.

Recipe Of The Month

Skillet Sausage Stuffing



Ingredients

In a large skillet, cook the sausage, celery, onion and mushrooms over medium heat until meat is no longer pink. Add garlic: cook 1 minute longer: drain. Stir in broth and sage. Bring to a boil. Stir in stuffing mix. Cover and remove from heat: let stand for 5 minutes. Fluff with a fork.

1/2 cup sliced fresh mushrooms
1 large clove, minced
1-1/2 cups reduced-sodium chicken broth
1 teaspoon rubbed sage
1 package (6 ounces) stuffing mix





School District Update

Daggett School Board Highlights – October 2024

The Daggett School District met in Manila on October 8th at 6PM. This meeting followed a work session that began at 5PM. Highlights of the Board meeting are noted below:

One of the responsibilities of the Daggett School Board is to set the school year calendar. Consequently, the Board will be determining the 2025-26 school year calendar at our next meeting in November. To assist the Board in making this decision a survey is planned to be sent out. The results of this survey, along with any other comments the Board receives, will be considered in making the school calendar for next year. You can also attend our November 12th Board meeting to comment directly. We look forward to your participation in this process!

Flaming Gorge Elementary (FGE) School Principal Mindy Terry requested a variance for the FGE Community Council since attendance at council meetings has not met required levels. This is a challenge for many small schools. The Board approved a temporary variance for the number of participants on the council. Community councils develop plans, which are then approved by the Board, to spend State Institutional Trust Lands Administration (SITLA) funding that is allocated to each school. These funds are vital to student success. The Board encourages all parents/guardians of students to get involved in your Community Council.

MHS Principal Browning reported that the State of Utah just completed its 2023-24 Accountability Report rankings for every high school in Utah. Manila HS ranked 16th out of all high schools, and 5th in public schools. The only public schools (all very large schools) ranked higher were Skyline, Bingham, Corner Canyon and Crimson Cliffs. Consequently, Manila HS is ranked the number 1 small school in Utah! The metrics used to determine these rankings were achievement, overall growth, growth of the lowest 25%, and post-secondary readiness. Congratulations to the students, teachers, administrators and everyone else who was involved in making Manila HS #1!!

The Board began planning for the 2024 School District Social. District employees and spouses mark your calendars. This year's social is planned for December 10 at 6PM. The social will be held at the Manila Elementary School.

The Board is excited to announce that Manila High School's Musical "NEWSIES" has been scheduled for November 14, 15 and 16 at 7:00 PM nightly. The performances will be presented at Manila High School's Black Box Theater. Tickets can be purchased using the QR code below for \$10 each, or at the Manila HS office for \$8 each. Manila HS productions have always been outstanding and are great entertainment. Hope to see you there!

Permit tags are \$15.00 in person at vendors and our offices as well as online at www.recreation.gov. If you choose to purchase your permit online at Recreation.gov there is a service fee.

Fourth graders may receive a free Christmas tree tag by following the instructions on the website www.everykidoutdoors.gov. Your free tag must be picked up in person at a Forest Service Office.

Flaming Gorge Fire and EMS District

There have been several changes to the fire and EMS services in Daggett County over the past year, and we want to bring everyone up to speed. For starters, many have asked what even is the Flaming Gorge Fire and EMS District? This district is established as a “local service district” in accordance with Utah law. As a tax-funded service district, operations are overseen by an elected board of directors (similar to a school board) and a management team. The Daggett County Commissioners recognized the need for improved emergency services in the county, and requested the formation of a district so that management and funding could be specifically focused on fire and EMS services.

Over the past year, some planned changes to emergency services have started taking form. First, through an act of annexation, the Town of Manila became part of the Flaming Gorge Fire and EMS District. As part of this process, the district took over funding and oversight of the Manila Fire Department and ownership of the Manila Fire Station was transferred from the town to the district. Then, this past spring the Daggett County Commissioners initiated the process of transitioning ambulance services from the county to the district. Over the summer, the district hired an EMS Director, its first full-time employee, and in just the past month received official license through the State of Utah and the Center of Medicare/Medicaid Services as an ambulance service provider. This explains some changes you’ve probably noticed, like ambulances parked in the Manila Fire Station and new logos on a few fire vehicles.

With all of those changes happening in just the past year, you may be wondering what’s next? Well, the next phase for the Flaming Gorge Fire and EMS District focuses on increasing and improving the services we’re offering. The district was recently awarded a grant for over \$9,000 from the State of Utah to cover the cost of wildland firefighter training and new wildland firefighting personal protective equipment (PPE). Additionally, the district has applied for \$200,000 in funding through the Community Impact Board (CIB) for the purchase of a new advanced life support equipped paramedic response vehicle.

The board of directors and district management share the goal of ensuring efficient, competent and well-equipped response to emergencies of any kind, ranging from fires and hazmat incidents to medical emergencies, motor vehicle crashes, or farm accidents. Ongoing investments in equipment and personnel will ensure we’re able to meet the needs of property owners, residents, and visitors across Daggett County. Partnership with the Dutch John Fire Department will always be important for us to serve the east side of the district. While not yet a part of the district, residents of Dutch John will have the opportunity to vote on the question of annexation into the district in the upcoming election. Should Dutch John join the district, an “at large” board member position will be reassigned to a resident or property owner from within the boundaries of Dutch John.

Without a doubt, our greatest need is more firefighters and EMTs from within our community. If you’ve ever thought of serving your neighbors by joining the fire department or ambulance service, then now is a great time to join the team at the Flaming Gorge Fire and EMS District. Open Burning Season Opens Nov. 1st

Remember these important guidelines:

- Dispatch 435-789-4222 *must* be notified of all open burning. Call *before* starting a fire.
- A permit from the Utah Dept. of Air Quality is required for open burning in the town limits of Manila or Dutch John (<https://deq.utah.gov/air-quality/air-quality-permitting>).
- No permit is required during open burn season in unincorporated areas, **but dispatch must still be notified!**
- The clearing index must be more than 500' for any burning, search Airshed 7 at: <https://www.weather.gov/SLC/ClearingIndex>.
- Do not leave! Attend the fire and have water or another means to extinguish fire on hand at all times.
- No burning in windy conditions or on red flag days.
- Open burning is for disposing of clippings, brush, and plant materials from property clean-up activities. No trash, rubbish, tires, oil, or like materials are allowed in open burning.
- Remember, YOU are responsible for any costs incurred if a response team is required for a fire that has not been reported or has gotten out of control.






DeLon Wayne Pollock
