Roast strawberry tart

with rosewater chantilly cream

Cut tops off strawberries, leaving any leaves attached, and place tops in a jar. Cover hulled strawberries and chill until ready to roast. Press down lightly on strawberry tops in the jar and pour over the vinegar, topping up with extra vinegar to cover, if needed. Put lid on jar and leave to infuse in the fridge overnight.

The next day, strain infused strawberry tops over a measuring jug and reserve 300ml liquid. Any remaining liquid can be stored in an airtight container in the fridge for up to 3 months (see note, opposite). Place 300ml liquid in a large saucepan with 1/2 cup (110g) sugar and cook, stirring occasionally, over high heat for 8-10 minutes, until slightly syrupy. Slice or halve 6 of the hulled strawberries and toss in the cooling syrup. Set aside until ready to serve.

Whip the creme fraiche, cream and extra 1/4 cup (55g) sugar in a large bowl until soft peaks. Fold in the rosewater. Refrigerate for 30 minutes at least, to firm up before serving. Preheat the oven to 200°C/180°C fan-forced. Grease a large baking tray and line with baking paper. Trim pastry sheet to a square (or see note, opposite) and place on prepared tray. Slice remaining pastry into 4 long strips. Brush pastry square edges with egg wash and arrange strips along each edge to form a border. Prick inside of border all over with a fork. Brush border with egg wash (making sure not to brush the square). Freeze for 15 minutes, then bake for 25-30 minutes, until puffed and golden. Meanwhile, arrange remaining whole hulled strawberries, cut side down, in a roasting pan. Roast for 10 minutes alongside the pastry, until strawberries just start to soften and release their juices.

To serve, transfer tart shell to a serving plate and gently push the middle down to flatten. Spread base of tart with cream. Spoon roasted strawberries on top and scatter with syrup-coated strawberries. Scrape strawberry cooking juices from the roasting pan into the syrup. Serve immediately, with strawberry syrup on the side.



Ingredients (8)

- 1kg strawberries
- 1 cup (250ml) white wine vinegar, plus extra, if required
- 1/2 cup (110g) caster sugar, plus 1/4 cup (55g) extra
- 200g creme fraiche
- 200g thickened cream
- 1 tsp rosewater, or to taste
- 375g sheet frozen puff pastry, just thawed (we used Carême, see note, opposite)
- 1 egg, lightly beaten



Daggett School Board Highlights – January 2025

It's been a while since we last reported our highlights so we're going to reach back a few months to catch up, and then report on January's highlights. At our November 12th meeting the Board reviewed and approved the Utah K-12 Comprehensive School Counseling Program Components Document. This document refers to our school counseling program. A scheduled Fee Hearing was also held and the spending plan for FCCLA (Family, Career and Community Leaders of America) was reviewed and approved. At our December 10th meeting the Board approved the 2026-27 school year calendar. After careful consideration of all the comments we received from our survey (the survey was about 50/50 for a calendar change) the Board decided to continue our current calendar for the 2026-27 school year. Consequently, school will begin in August and end just before Memorial Weekend. Details of the schedule can be found on the School District's website. The Board wishes to thank all those who provided comments. We very much appreciated your thoughts and ideas. The Board also reviewed the 2024 District Financial Audit which found that the district had no control issues and consequently, the auditor didn't have any concerns. This is great news. The FFA Land Judging Team reported that they placed in the top 5 in Utah and in so doing they qualified to compete at the National FFA Convention in May. Team members include Wyatt Muir, Keylie Boren, Reagan Browning and Grady Pendleton. The team requested that the Board approve their attendance at the National Convention. Approval will be considered at the Board's January meeting. Way to go Manila FFA!!! The Board also reviewed and approved Superintendent Northcott's 2024 evaluation. 18 individuals participated in his evaluation, and he received a summary score of 7.2 out of 8 which is excellent. Thanks Superintendent Northcott for all that you do. The Daggett School District held their 2024 District Social on December 10th at the Manila Elementary School and by all accounts everyone had a wonderful time and had a great meal. Our thanks to all the district employees and staff who helped to make this event special. The Daggett School Board attended the USBA (Utah School Board Association) Conference on Jan 9th in SLC. Every Utah school board attended this conference so there was a lot of discussion and coordination. Each board member had an opportunity to attend a range of breakout sessions that included AI, school safety, current legal concerns, sports, legislative priorities, risk management and others. We were also able to sit down with fellow school board members from Uintah and Duchesne which proved to be very informative. We're all hoping that we can use what we learned at this conference to improve our own school board and to make our

students even more successful. At our January 14th meeting the Board approved travel for the Manila FFA Lands Judging Team to attend the National FFA Convention (see previous note). Superintendent Northcott announced that he was no longer going to be the Manila Elementary principal in addition to his other superintendent responsibilities. A new principal will be hired and Superintendent Northcott plans to focus all his efforts as the district superintendent. The Board also reviewed the 2024 Nursing/Health Report. The report explained our drug testing policy, which is that all students involved in extracurricular activities are drug tested at the beginning of their season, then randomly tested once a week from that point forward. It also summarized 2024 health encounters. In 2024 there were 305 health encounters where students remained in school (most of these were minor). There were also 40 instances where students were given medication, one where the student was sent home, and one where 911 was called. Our thanks to our part-time nurse Mikayla Potter. Principal Browning reported on Manila HS Concurrent Enrollment for 2024. This program makes college courses available to high school students for both high school and college credit (at a substantial cost reduction). The program is offered through Utah State University and Snow College. The number of students participating in this program has almost doubled since last year which is great news. During the fall of 2024 there were 18 students participating, with 17 students participating so far in 2025. Peggy White, representing Daggett County, made a presentation to the Board requesting that Daggett School District help to fund a restroom that would be located near the baseball diamond and county pickleball courts on county property. The estimated cost of the restroom would be about \$30,000. Having a restroom at this location would provide a substantial benefit to students and the public since it would be used at multiple school functions (baseball games, weekend tournaments, golf and track practices, and regional finals), county events, and pickleball players. Daggett County is proposing that they would take care of all future maintenance and operational expenses, and that the restroom would always be open during school events. A decision will be made at February's board meeting about providing some amount of funding assistance for this restroom. The Board appreciates Daggett County and their numerous efforts in helping to accommodate school district activities. There will be a Board work meeting on January 28th at 6 PM. This meeting will be held at the district office. Our next scheduled Board meeting is planned for February 11th, 6 PM also at the district office. Meeting notes and audio recordings of all Board meetings can be found on-line at the Daggett School District website.

What's Happening at Daggett Schools

- We're getting excited to have Missoula Children's Theater here in a few months. Our students will be performing Snow White and the Seven Dwarves. The big show is scheduled for March 14th.
- Recently Safe Routes Utah was here to educate our students about crossing roads safely. The students really enjoyed the presentation, and all received reflective armbands to wear when it is dark outside.
- This year we have been using an app to track our school's reading goals called Beanstack. It is sponsored by Road To Success. This spring the students that have logged a certain number of minutes will be entered into a drawing to win a bike and helmet. So far this year we have logged over 21,000 minutes! It's been very fun, and we have loved seeing what our kiddos are reading.

Manila Elementary School (Tameka Smith, MES Secretary)

- We're thrilled to announce that all of our students met their reading goals last quarter, earning a fun trip to the roller skating rink!
- On January 16th, we also had a *Dress as Your Favorite Sport Day*, filled with team spirit and creativity.
- Right now, students are taking their middle of the year tests, and we're excited to see their progress.
- Congratulations to *Brexlee Lail*, our Student of the Month for January, recognized for her hard work and positive attitude!

Manila High School

- This last fall the girls volleyball team placed 2nd at the state championships. Amazing job girls!!
- At the cross country state championships Daniel Draper placed 2nd. Great job Daniel!!
- Manila HS's production of Newsies was fantastic. This production was enjoyed by a full house at each of their three performances. Way to go Manila HS!!
- Manila HS is deep into the girls and boys basketball season. Both teams won their last games, the boys team against Kemmerer, Wyo., and the girls team against Tintic.
- Our cheerleaders went to divisionals and earned a 1st in dance and a 3rd in cheer and show. They will compete at state on January 22nd.
- Our FFA Lands Judging Team qualified to compete at the National Convention in May. Good luck!
- Homecoming is scheduled for January 24th and 25th.

Utah School Boards Association (USBA) and Daggett School Board 2025 Legislative Priorities

The Daggett School Board supports the USBA 2025 legislative priorities and encourages Daggett County citizens to both get involved in the legislative process and to become aware of the challenges facing public education in Utah and Daggett County. The following summary of these priorities is intended to increase your awareness of what the USBA is asking our legislators to pursue in 2025. The Utah legislative session begins on January 21st and lasts for 45 days. All of these are being advocated to improve the education of our youth and to best prepare them to succeed in life.

We encourage you to get involved by contacting your legislative representatives and letting them know your concerns.

Public schools fulfill a vital purpose in the education and preparation of informed and responsible citizens who:

1. Fully understand and lawfully exercise their individual rights and liberties'
2. Become self-reliant and able to provide for themselves and their families; and
3. Contribute to the public good and the health, welfare, and security of the state and nation. (Utah Code, Public Education System, 53E-2-201)

The Utah School Boards Association, the Utah School Superintendents Association, and the Utah Association of School Business Officials are dedicated to working collaboratively with the Utah State Legislature to ensure that each student is prepared for college, career, and life. An educated citizenry will further the position of Utah as a state leader in the nation.

UTAH AS AN EDUCATIONAL LEADER

- Education Working Group – Establish an education working group that enables legislative leaders and K-12 public education leaders to work together to solve issues facing education.
- Create an educational funding framework to increase the Minimum School Program above growth & inflation.

SUPPORT EACH STUDENT

- A minimum of three percent (3%) increase above inflation and growth in the WPU (weighted pupil unit) to provide LEAs (Lead Educational Agency) the flexibility to address the unique learning needs of each student.
- Increase the targeted funding for at-risk students to better provide resources to meet their needs. (R277-708-2)

POLICY & PROCESS

- Economic Stabilization Account – Establish and implement a plan for the Economic Stabilization Account that allocates a minimum of 85% of available funds to go directly to LEAs to support educator-directed hours, small school building funds, school safety, and capital needs.
- Tier II Retirement – Allow an LEA to pay all or part of the required member contribution for retirement, which exceeds the contribution cap, on behalf of the participating Tier II Hybrid employees.



Local leaders and elected officials of Daggett, Duchesne, and Uintah Counties,

The TriCounty Board of Health is concerned with the trend of decreasing vaccination rates in our community. These declining rates significantly increase the risk of future disease outbreaks. We are striving to raise awareness of this issue with local agencies, leaders, and community members. We invite all individuals to openly discuss the incredible historic value that vaccines have provided in saving countless lives. We express sincere concern that in recent years the topic of childhood vaccinations has become controversial. We encourage honest discussions about the science, history, and health impacts of vaccines. We are confident that the value of vaccinations will be recognized through the health of our residents and/or outbreaks of preventable diseases. We strongly encourage parents to review vaccination schedules with a health professional to ensure up-to-date status is maintained.

Over the past four years the percent of parents seeking exemption from childhood vaccinations for TriCounty kindergartners increased from 4.8% to 11.9%.



Correspondingly, the rate of adequately immunized kindergartners dropped from 86% to 80%.





Who Qualifies?

Anyone who:

- Has the desire to achieve home ownership
- Does not have an existing mortgage
- Does not exceed the annual income guidelines
- Has good credit and can qualify for a mortgage to cover the cost of building
- Is capable of fulfilling the 30 hour per week labor contribution requirement
