

THE CONTROL OF NOXIOUS WEEDS IN DAGGETT COUNTY
A SERIOUS ISSUE THAT LOCAL RESIDENTS NEED TO BE MADE AWARE OF

The issue and control of noxious weeds in the State of Utah and Daggett County is a serious problem that all residents need to be made aware of.

Notice is hereby given to Daggett County property owners of County Ordinances 10-18, and 10-16 which defines noxious weeds and the County's authority in controlling noxious weeds within the County. These ordinances are in compliance with the Utah Noxious Weed Act.

The Daggett County Weed Board , established by the Daggett County Commissioners in June of 2010, is responsible *“for the formulation and implementation of a coordinated noxious weed control program designed to prevent and control noxious weeds within the county”*.

If the Weed Board determines that a particular property within the county requires prompt and definite attention to prevent or control targeted noxious weeds, *it has the authority* to properly notify the person in possession of said property that their property has been declared a public nuisance, specifying when and what action should be taken to control their weed problem. If, within five (5) working days after being notified, the owner of said property fails to take appropriate action, the County Weed Manager under the direction of the Daggett County Weed Board has the authority to perform any necessary work to address the identified weed problem.

Residents need to be made aware that *“any expense incurred by the County in controlling the noxious weeds is **paid by the property owner**. . .If not paid within 90 days . . . are collectable by the County Treasurer at the time general property taxes are collected.”*

Ned Brady recently accepted the part time position as the Daggett County Weed Manager. He will be working with the Daggett County Weed Board and County Commissioners to develop a working plan to control noxious weeds in Daggett County. He will also be the liaison between local residents and the County. Limited funds are available to help with the control of “Noxious” weeds only. Call for more information.

The DCWB and cooperating agencies are willing to advise and assist property owners on eradicating their noxious weed problem. Reimbursement for weed spraying chemicals is available.
