Memories of Ike and his famous sayings always make family and friends smile. In memory of Ike his family donated money for the 2019 **Cow Country Jr Rodeo (CCJR)** Scholarship. Sharon Quick was the recipient of this year's scholarship. "Hard work, dedication, responsibility and willingness to take chances are the things that have impacted my life the most. These qualities that I have learned about in the arena have affected my life in a greater form than anyone could ever imagine. To me there is nothing better than being inside the arena on a horse doing what I love to do. If it were not for this sport I would not have grown in to the young woman I am and still striving to become," stated Quick in her scholarship application. CCJR is a series of five rodeos held at the Daggett County rodeo arena, for participants from age five to the summer after they graduate high school. Rodeo participants come from all over southwest Wyoming, northeast Utah, and even some from Colorado and Idaho. Municipal Elections 2019

The Towns of Dutch John and Manila will be conducting Municipal Elections this year By Mail. Daggett County will only be assisting with Voter Registration. Ballots went out in mid October, so if you have not received a ballot please contact the Clerk/Treasurer's Office at 435-784-3154 immediately to check the status of your registration. For specific information on the Town of Dutch John contact Harriett Dickerson at 435-880-8042. For Manila election information contact Marlana Connor at 435-784-3143. If you have moved it is important that you update your voter registration online at www.vote.utah.gov or while updating your license or in person at the Clerk's Office in Manila. October 29th was the last day to submit an Absentee Ballot Request or register in person at the County Clerk's Office.

Due to the fact that these elections are vote by mail there will be **no polling places for early voting or on Election Day. Mailed ballots must be postmarked by Monday, November 4th, 2019 in order to be counted.** You may drop off your Ballots at the Manila Town Office until 8pm on Election Day or at Clerk Harriett Dickerson's house in Dutch John at 103 2nd Ave. until 8pm on Election Day.

March 2020 will be a Presidential Primary election. If you live in the County and vote here, contact the Clerk/Treasurer's Office to insure you have a ballot if you have any question of whether you are registered here.






THANKSGIVING 411

The English colonists we call Pilgrims celebrated days of **thanksgiving** as part of their religion. But these were days of prayer, not days of feasting. Our national holiday really stems from the feast held in the autumn of 1621 by the 50 Pilgrims and the 90 Wampanoag Indians to celebrate the colony's **first** successful harvest.

Myth: The **first Thanksgiving** took **place** in Plymouth, Mass.
Facts: If you learned in school that **Thanksgiving** started with the Pilgrims and the Indians feasting together in New England, your education might have been over-simplified. It's true that such a feast took **place** — and it was a doozy of

a dinner. According to what traditionally is known as "The **First Thanksgiving**," at Plymouth Colony it contained waterfowl, venison, ham, lobster, clams, berries, fruit, pumpkin, and squash-not turkey. It lasted three days.... also **Thanksgiving didn't become a national holiday until over 200 years later!**


Phragmites stand

Phragmites (Common Reed)

Native to North America. It is a weed in wetlands, marshes, and waterways, where it can form impenetrable stands. It is sold by nurseries and is commonly used in erosion control. It is tolerant of fire and salinity.

Description; Its a perennial rhizomes grass, with hollow, sometimes creeping stems. It grows up to 10 feet tall, with rhizomes as deep as 3 feet, rough- margined leaves up to one and a half feet long. Flowers form in dense, brown, feathery plums at stems tip. It is commonly mistaken for giant reed. however the flower bearing stems on giant reed are hairless, where those of phragmites have silky hairs.

Control: Do not plant. Because of extensive rhizomes, most mechanical control measures are only partially successful, and some actually encourage its spread. Research on bio-control agents is on going. Systemic herbicides can be effective. Contact your state or county weed specialist for specific, updated information.

O KELLY DEE WALK 5/13/1977 ~ 9/27/2019


