If you are desirous to run, you can go through the Petition Signing process or the Caucus System. The Utah Presidential Primary is March 3rd. State and local elections will be held June 30th, 2020.

Why Youth Mental Health First Aid?

Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches you **how to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders.** This 8-hour training gives adults who work with youth the skills they need to reach out and provide initial support to adolescents (ages 12-18) who may be developing a mental health or substance use problem and help connect them to the appropriate care.

WHAT IT COVERS

- Common signs and symptoms of mental illnesses in this age group, including:
 - Anxiety
 - Depression
 - Eating disorders
 - Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD)
- Common signs and symptoms of substance use.
- How to interact with an adolescent in crisis.
- How to connect the adolescent with help.

WHO SHOULD TAKE IT

- Teachers
- School staff
- Coaches
- Camp counselors
- Youth group leaders
- Parents
- People who work with youth

The course will teach you how to apply the ALGEE action plan:

- **Assess** for risk of suicide or harm
- **Listen** nonjudgmentally
- **Give** reassurance and information
- **Encourage** appropriate professional help
- **Encourage** self-help and other support strategies

Recipe of the Month

MEXICAN FISH

INGREDIENTS

1 1/2 POUNDS COD

1 CUP SALSA

1 CUP SHREDDED SHARP
CHEDDAR CHEESE

1/2 CUP COARSELY CRUSHED
CORN CHIPS¹

AVOCADO - PEELED, PITTED AND
SLICED¹

1/4 CUP SOUR CREAM

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).
Lightly grease one 8x12 inch baking dish.



Rinse fish fillets under cold water, and pat dry with paper towels. Lay fillets side by side in the prepared baking dish. Pour the salsa over the top, and sprinkle evenly with the shredded cheese. Top with the crushed corn chips. Bake, uncovered, in the preheated oven for 15 minutes, or until fish is opaque and flakes with a fork. Serve topped with sliced avocado and sour cream.
