

WE WOULD LIKE TO EXPRESS APPRECIATION TO THE TOWNS AND OTHER ENTITIES FOR THEIR CONTINUED WILLINGNESS TO UNITE AND WORK TOGETHER AS A COMMUNITY AS WE FACE THE CHALLENGES ASSOCIATED WITH COVID-19.

ON JUNE 19, 2020, GOVERNOR GARY HERBERT ANNOUNCED THAT DAGGETT, DUCHESNES, AND UINTAH COUNTIES WOULD BE MOVING TO THE "GREEN" PHASE OF THE UTAH LEADS TOGETHER PLAN. DAGGETT COUNTY STILL HAS ZERO CONFIRMED CASES OF COVID-19, BUT THE SURROUNDING AREAS ARE REPORTING A RISE IN POSITIVE TESTING. DUE TO THE INCREASED RISK, WE ASK RESIDENTS AND VISITORS TO CONTINUE THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS: SOCIAL DISTANCE WHEN POSSIBLE; WEAR A FACE COVERING WHEN IN PUBLIC AND WHEN SOCIAL DISTANCING (SIX FEET) IS NOT FEASIBLE; PRACTICE PROPER HYGIENE; STAY HOME WHEN SICK AND MONITOR SYMPTOMS AND GET TESTED WHEN SYMPTOMATIC.

TRICOUNTY HEALTH OFFICER, JORDAN MATHIS REMINDS US, "IT IS IMPORTANT FOR EVERYONE TO UNDERSTAND THAT THIS TRANSITION TO "GREEN" DOES NOT MEAN THE RISK OF COVID-19 IS GONE. IN FACT, THE RISK HAS NEVER BEEN GREATER. IT SIMPLY MEANS THAT THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR MITIGATING THE RISK HAS BEEN TRANSFERRED FROM PUBLIC HEALTH AND THE GOVERNMENT TO EACH INDIVIDUAL AND BUSINESS. IT IS CONTINGENT ON EACH OF US TO DO OUR PART TO PROTECT OURSELVES AND OTHERS. I URGE EVERYONE TO FOLLOW THE RECOMMENDATIONS GIVEN TO KEEP OUR COMMUNITIES SAFE AND HEALTHY."

The Importance of Internet Bandwidth

Bandwidth is the amount of data that can be transferred over an Internet connection in a given amount of time. It's measured in megabytes per second or Mbps. Most people call it speed, but speed and bandwidth are really the same thing.

During the pandemic, families learned that bandwidth matters. In many households, one or both spouses were forced to work from home while primary-aged children continued their studies online. Added to that, some were also cord-cutters, meaning they no longer subscribe to cable or satellite TV service. Instead, they rely on the Internet to stream the movies and tv shows they watch. On top of this, many families have kids that are way into gaming.

All of a sudden, a family of four, at home 24/7, was maxing out their bandwidth. Video conferencing calls dropped off, other important aspects of working or studying from home suffered, movies buffered, and games lagged.

To help satisfy this new demand when it was needed most, from mid-March through June, Union turned up their Internet speeds to the highest bandwidth available – for free. In some cases, homes started getting 1 Gbps (1000 Mbps). And what a difference it made! No more buffering, no more slow loading websites, and gamers were happy again.

Some of Union's customers in the town of Manila were the biggest beneficiaries of the upgrade program. That's because in Manila fiber-optic cables run all the way to the home or business receiving service. It's called Fiber to the Premises, and it's the fastest type of Internet available – anywhere on Earth. While not everybody needs the speed of a 1 Gbps connection, in Manila it's possible.

Mutual Self Help Housing Program

What is Self Help Housing?

Self Help Housing is a program for low income families who want to achieve the dream of home ownership. Qualified families work together under the supervision of a Construction Manager to construct their homes.

Who Qualifies?

Anyone who:

- Has the desire to achieve home ownership
 - Does not have an existing mortgage
 - Does not exceed the annual income guidelines
- Has good credit and can qualify for a mortgage to cover the cost of building
- Is capable of fulfilling the 30 hour per week labor contribution requirement

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

CHICKEN AND BACON PASTA WITH SPINACH AND TOMATOES IN GARLIC CREAM SAUCE



INGREDIENTS

2 tablespoons olive oil
1 lb chicken (chicken breasts or tenderloins)
1 teaspoon paprika
1 teaspoon Italian seasoning (thyme, oregano, basil - combined)
5 tomatoes (medium, chopped in large cubes)
1 cup spinach cooked
5 garlic cloves minced
1/4 teaspoon red pepper flakes, crushed
6 bacon strips, COOKED, DRAINED OF FAT, AND CHOPPED
1 1/3 cups half and half
1 1/3 cups Parmesan cheese, shredded
10 oz penne pasta (for gluten-free version, use gluten-free brown-rice penne)
1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, shredded, for serving



In a large skillet, on high heat, heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil until hot. Add chicken and cook on one side on high heat for 1 minute. While it cooks, sprinkle the uncooked sides of the chicken with paprika and Italian seasoning. Flip the chicken over, and cook on the other side for 1 minute on high heat. Reduce heat to medium, flip chicken over again and cook, covered, for several minutes until no longer pink in the center. Remove chicken from the pan and keep chicken warm.

To the same pan (but without chicken), add chopped tomatoes, spinach, garlic, crushed red pepper, 1/3 of the chicken (sliced into small strips) and half the bacon (already cooked and drained of fat). Mix everything. Add half and half and bring to boil. Only after half and half starts boiling, add shredded Parmesan cheese - immediately reduce to simmer and stir, while simmering, until the cheese melts and makes the sauce creamy, only about 1 minute (at most 2 minutes). Then, immediately remove from heat. Season with more crushed red pepper and salt, if needed.

In the mean time bring a large pot of water to boil, add pasta and cook it according to instructions. Drain the pasta, rinse with cold water and drain again.

Add pasta to the skillet with the sauce. Add remaining half of bacon (cooked and drained of fat). Season with more salt if necessary. Slice the remaining 2/3 of chicken into thin strips. To serve, top the pasta with chicken strips and shredded Parmesan cheese.

BUSINESS SPOTLIGHT

Wild West Paddle

Christijan and Valorie Draper bought the Wild West Paddle Company from their friends John and the late Debbie Weaver last year.

“We thought the business could be a great way to work together as a family,” Christijan said. “We hope to teach our kids a good work ethic and to help them save some money for education and church service in the future.”

Wild West Paddle Company rents paddleboards, kayaks, and canoes for anyone wanting to get out on the water at Flaming Gorge. The company has a permit with the U.S. Forest Service to be able to deliver the boards and boats to various places around the Gorge. The Drapers say their love for the outdoors helped align them with the business vision. Christijan has a master’s degree in youth and family recreation. Valorie grew up hiking, canoeing, camping and participating in many other outdoor activities in Idaho. The couple met while driving tour buses in Alaska.

“I think outdoor adventure of any kind is in our DNA,” Christijan said. “And we love helping other people enjoy being out in nature as well.”

The Drapers had rented from Wild West Paddle Company several times in previous years when the Weavers still owned the business. Valorie said it was always more of an adventure for her family to have the boats and paddleboards at their fingertips when they visited the Flaming Gorge National Recreation Area.

“We had so much fun,” she said. “There was always more laughter and more variety when we had the paddleboards and kayaks.”

The Drapers moved to Manila in the spring of 2018. But, they were coming to familiar territory. Christijan Draper’s parents had been full-time Manila residents for more than a decade. His father, the late Duane Draper, served Daggett County as a physician’s assistant at the clinic. His mother, Teresa Draper, has been a staple at Manila Elementary School for many years.

“We have been coming to Manila every summer or fall to visit my parents,” Christijan said. “A couple of years ago, we decided we should move here. It’s been great. We love the community and the sunsets are amazing,” Christijan said, then added with a wry smile, “But the winter has taken some getting used to.”

Larence Milton Beck, age 87, passed away peacefully on June 20, 2020 in Logan, Utah. Milton was born on September 22, 1932 to Larence Reuben and Beatrice Eudora (Edwards) in Vernal, Utah and grew up in McKinnon, Wyoming.
