

**BOARD OF CANVASSERS FOR THE SEPTEMBER 8, 2020  
DUTCH JOHN DISSOLUTION ELECTION,  
HELD ON SEPTEMBER 15, 2020 BEGINNING AT 10:35 AM  
IN THE COMMISSION CHAMBERS IN THE DAGGETT COUNTY COURTHOUSE  
DAGGETT COUNTY, UTAH**

**PRESENT:** Commission Chairman Randy Asay; Commissioner Matt Tippetts; Commissioner Jack Lytle and Clerk/Treasurer: Brian Raymond Also present were Niel Lund

The Board of Canvass convened at 10:35 AM

A Petition was presented to the Daggett County Clerk on May 26, 2020, which was not deemed to meet the requirements of Utah State Code 10-2-701 through 10-2-710 and was rejected. Another petition was presented to the Daggett County Clerk on June 12, 2020 which met the requirements of State Code. The petition contained 33 signatures and 29 signatures were verified by the Clerk's office which was sufficient to send the petition to the District Court on June 18, 2020. On July 2, 2020 Judge Edwin T. Peterson ruled that an election should be conducted by the Clerk/Treasurer of Daggett County and The Question "Shall the Municipality of Dutch John Be Dissolved?" was presented to the Dutch John voters for an election on September 8, 2020. Ballots were mailed out starting August 19, 2020. Four days of Early Voting were held at the Daggett County Courthouse, September 1 - September 4, 2020. In addition Ballots were able to be mailed in or dropped off at the Courthouse or the two outdoor Ballot Boxes one for Manila and one for Dutch John at the Conference hall in Dutch John. A full day of Voting was available at the Dutch John Conference Hall on Tuesday, September 8, 2020 from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm. In addition to three people counting the ballots there were two watchers who counted with the poll workers.


There were 111 By Mail/Absentee ballots issued to Dutch John voters. No ballots came in after Election Day with or without the proper postmark. There were 4 ballots that originally did not have matching signatures and all but one were able to be counted. Three Provisional Ballots were received and counted and one ballot came in at the last minute from the ballot box and was counted with the provisional ballots for greater anonymity.


