

**BOARD OF CANVASSERS FOR THE JUNE 28, 2022 PRIMARY ELECTION,
HELD ON JULY 12, 2022 BEGINNING AT 11:00 AM
IN THE COMMISSION CHAMBERS IN DAGGETT COUNTY, UTAH**

PRESENT: Commission Chairman Matt Tippets; Commissioner Randy Asay; Commissioner Jack Lytle and Clerk Brian Raymond Also present were: Brandi Pearson

The Board of Canvassers convened at 11:00 am.

Daggett County continues to be a Vote By Mail County. Ballots were sent to all who requested them. Two people had inadvertently checked that they did not want a ballot by mail, and did not originally receive a ballot, but ballots were mailed to them as requested when the error was discovered. Voters had the option of mailing their ballots in, voting early in person, dropping ballots into a drop box or voting in person on Election Day.

There were originally 515 ballots sent out. We had 213 people vote in this primary for a 41.04% Voter Turnout. We received 72 ballots by mail but only 65 were able to be counted. We received 5 ballots that were not postmarked in time including two that weren't postmarked at all. Two mailed ballots had signatures that did not match that went unresolved and had to be rejected. An additional 9 ballots were returned by the postal service with the addresses being unknown or no longer voting in Daggett County. There were 3 ballots returned where we could obtain addresses within Utah, so these voters were mailed new ballots. We had the 2 voters who did not receive ballots and requested them, plus 1 unaffiliated voter who affiliated with the Republican Party and was mailed a ballot, and we had another Unaffiliated Voter affiliate and vote on Election Day, which took us to a total of 519 ballots.

Early Voting in Manila took place on June 21, 22 and 24, 2022 from 9 am to 5 pm and in Dutch John on June 23rd from 3 pm to 7 pm. There were only 2 voters that took advantage of the use of the Express Vote machines during Early Voting and 13 voters voted in person using the Express Vote machines on Election Day. Most of our Election Day Staff was new this year and unfortunately, we had one Democrat slip through the cracks and vote on election Day as all parties are listed in the Register and the Register Clerk did not notice this person was not a Republican. We will do further training so this does not happen in the future. The Lt. Governor's office was notified and they said that it was too late to do anything about it and to fully disclose it, so we are doing that. There were 11 ballots that we received that the signatures did not match and 1 that didn't have a signature. We were able to cure 7 of the 12 ballots and count them. Two were processed today with the group of ballots from Dutch John that came from the Ballot Box on Election Day and were collected at 8 pm, but took 2 days to get to us by registered mail.


