

**BOARD OF CANVASSERS FOR THE NOVEMBER 8, 2022 GENERAL ELECTION,
HELD ON NOVEMBER 22, 2022 BEGINNING AT 1:00 PM
IN THE COMMISSION CHAMBERS IN DAGGETT COUNTY, UTAH**

PRESENT: Acting Commission Chairman Jack Lytle; Commissioner Randy Asay; and Treasurer Brianne Carter met as the Board of Canvassers and Clerk Brian Raymond and Sheriff Erik Bailey also attended.

The Board of Canvassers convened at 1:09 pm.

Clerk Brian Raymond said that Daggett County continues to be a Vote By Mail County. Ballots were sent to all registered voters. Voters then had the option of mailing their ballots in, voting early in person, dropping ballots into a drop box or voting in person on Election Day.

There were originally 680 ballots sent out. We had 501 people vote in this primary for a 73.78% Voter Turnout. We received 447 ballots by mail or drop box but only 445 were able to be counted. We received 1 ballot that did not have a flap attached, but the flap later came in a separate envelope from the USPS and had a distinctive tear mark on it that matched the ballot envelope, so it was counted. We had 1 ballot returned as not deliverable. We had 25 people whose signatures were not verified and all but 1 were cured. Contact was attempted with the owner of the ballot that was not verified, but it never succeeded. We also had one person who returned their ballot, but registered before it was received in Salt Lake County, so we were unable to count that ballot.

Early Voting in Manila took place on October 28th and 31st and November 2 and 3rd, 2022 from 9 am to 5 pm and in Dutch John on November 1st, 2022 from 3 pm to 7 pm. There were 8 voters in Manila and 3 in Dutch John that took advantage of early voting this year. There were 47 voters that voted in person using the Express Vote machines on Election Day and we had 2 provisional ballots that were able to be counted, one from early voting and 1 from Election Day. The biggest challenge was that the County Clerk tested Positive for COVID the night before Election Day, which created a few minor hiccups. The DS200 used to process the in person votes had 6 ballots on the flash drive from a quick Logic and Accuracy test with a new employee. Unfortunately, the staff did not catch that before new ballots were run through the machine. Fortunately, the ballots had been removed and were not mixed in with the ballots for the day, so the ballots were able to rerun for the Canvass to give the correct numbers. In the process of trying to rerun the ballots it was discovered that the Early vote ballots were mixed in and so the ballots were reviewed on the computer and separated. The flash drive for in person election day voting failed and we had to use a Back-up Drive, which worked well. The Back-up drive was tested during the Logic and Accuracy testing. There were new ballots received and unprocessed ballots along with the 2 Provisional Ballots that were run between Election Day and the Canvass. The Logic and Accuracy tests were explained and the Audit was discussed. Commissioner Asay attended the Audit yesterday and watched as we reviewed the ballots and the signatures. A copy of the Audit form, Unofficial Results, Canvass Code and a Draft Canvass Report were provided to the Canvassers along with all the other election documents.


Release dates for ballot uploads to the Lt. Governor's Office for results were on November 8, 2022, and again tonight, November 22, 2022.

Motion to accept the Canvass as presented and amended was made by Commissioner Asay and seconded by Commissioner Lytle: with Commissioner Lytle, Commissioner Asay and Treasurer Carter all being in favor. The Official 2022 General Election results are as follows:




