




**AGENCY:** Rural Utilities Service, USDA

**ACTION:** Notice of Availability of an Environmental Assessment

**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the Rural Utilities Service (RUS), as required by the National Environmental Policy Act, is issuing an environmental assessment (EA) in connection with possible impacts related to a project proposed by Daggett County. The proposal is for construction of improvements for an asphalt paved trail along the north shoulder of SR-43. The Trail will continue along Stateline and Airport Road; however, this portion of the trail will share the existing roadway surface. Daggett County has applied to RUS to fund part of the project. The project includes funding from state agencies who are partnering on the project (UDOT, Parks and Recreation).

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:** The proposed project would consist of the following:

The SR-43 Multi-Use Trail Project consists of constructing a 10-foot-wide asphalt paved trail along SR-43. The trail will continue along Stateline Road and Airport Road (utilizing the exiting roadway area) in Daggett County utilizing a "Share the Road" signage. The trail runs along the north side of SR-43 beginning at the west Manila Utah town border and continuing east to the Wyoming State line east of Manila and then south-easterly along Stateline Road (CR-556) until it connects with Airport Road (CR-537/4301). The trail route then proceeds westerly along Airport Road to SR-43.

Along SR-43, the trail will primarily be separated from the highway. Through downtown Manila from 50 West to 150 East, the trail will be on the shoulder of SR-43 along with sidewalks. The existing Stateline Road will be paved, and the roadway will be signed as "Share the Road" to accommodate the trail. "Share the Road" signage will be provided along Airport Road.

CIVCO Engineering, Inc., an engineering and environmental consultant, prepared an environmental assessment for RUS that describes the project, assesses the proposed project's environmental impacts, and summarizes as applicable any mitigation measures used to minimize environmental effects. RUS has conducted an independent evaluation of the environmental assessment and believes that it accurately assesses the impacts of the proposed project.

The new separated trail portion of the project that runs along the north shoulder of SR-43 will be constructed in the shoulder area within the highway right of way. It is expected that some cut/fill slopes could extend beyond the highway r/w line and may require easements. Affected property owners will be compensated for any right of way or real property required with the project, or easements required as part of the trail construction.

No significant impacts are expected for the following environmental resources:

- Important Farmland (no effect)
- Formally Classified Lands (no effect)
- Floodplains (no effect)
- Cultural resources (no effect)
- Biological Resources (no effect)


Anticipated impacts for the following environmental resources:

Wetlands - the project area contains approximately 2.5 acres of potential wetlands. The trail construction along SR-43 will impact of fill about 0.988 acres of potential wetlands. Mitigation will be in accordance with USACE. Prior to construction, Daggett County will need a 404 permit from the USACE and a 401 Certification from the Utah Division of Environmental Quality.

Questions and comments should be sent to **RUS** at the address provided. **RUS** will accept questions and comments on the environmental assessment for [14] days from the date of publication of this notice.

Any final action by **RUS** related to the proposed project will be subject to, and contingent upon, compliance with all relevant Federal environmental laws and regulations and completion of environmental review procedures as prescribed by 7 CFR Part 1970, Environmental Policies and Procedures.



## **Daggett School Board Highlights – March and April 2025**

The highlights of our March 11<sup>th</sup> and April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2025 Board meetings in Manila are noted below:

The Board recognized Kellen Briggs and Rylee Martin as the Manila Elementary School Students of the Month for March and Emma Tippetts as the April Student of the Month. Each student of the month is chosen by their peers for their kindness and hard work. Way to go Manila Elementary School students!

After a review of several Utah school board policies concerning student board members, the Board developed a draft policy which would allow MHS students an opportunity to serve on the Board as student board members for a negotiated period (2 to 12 months), and to participate in all Board discussions and interactions. However, student board members would not be able to vote and would not be able to participate in executive sessions. It is hoped that student participation in Board meetings will lead to more informed Board decisions. It's also expected that this opportunity will help provide additional learning opportunities for our students. We're looking forward to this change. A copy of this draft policy is available for review on our website, or from Superintendent Northcott.

The Board approved the Master Fee Schedule & Spend Plan for 2025-2026 following a Fees Schedule Hearing on March 11. This plan is required by law and notes what the maximum student participation expenses would be for extracurricular activities. These expenses are reduced substantially with various teams and club fund-raising activities. This plan is available for your review on our website.

The Board approved Anna Dupaix's travel to the 2025 National Leadership Conference in Washington D.C. this summer. Anna will be attending as a FCCLA (Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America) Utah state officer. Way to go Anna!

The Board reviewed and approved the individual TSSP (Teacher and Student Success Plans) and Trustland Goals for 2025-2026 for each of our three schools: FGE, MES and MHS. These plans are funded by SITLA (Utah School and Institutional Trust Lands Administration) and provide valuable funding for our students. These plans are put together by each school's community council. These councils are composed of student

parents/guardians and school principals or other school employees. So, if you have a student in one of our schools, you are welcome to get involved!

In preparation for determining the 2025-2026 Daggett School budget the Board reviewed teacher salaries throughout Utah, enrollment projections, and FY 2026 Utah Legislative Revenue Estimates. In terms of total “District Paid” compensation, our teachers rank 24<sup>th</sup> out of 39 school districts. In terms of first year teacher salaries, Daggett School District ranks 31<sup>st</sup> at \$55,074.

Our next Board meeting is planned for May 13<sup>th</sup> at Manila (6:00PM). At this meeting we’ll be reviewing our preliminary budget for 2025-2026. Also coming up are the FGE, MES and MHS Awards Assemblies on Thursday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>. MHS Graduation Ceremony will also be on May 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7:30. Hope to see you there.
