Keeping you Informed

As you proceed along 1st West, just past the courthouse, note the commencement of Daggett County's new Community Center. This initiative has been made possible through a Community Impact Board (CIB) grant, substantial contributions from Northeast Counseling, and the collaboration of numerous other partners. This Center will house a new Uintah Basin Medical Center, offices for Northeast Counseling and the TriCounty Health Department, a Fitness Center equipped with over 15 new pieces of exercise equipment, a small dance studio for yoga, Ti Chi or other mat related exercises, and several small conference rooms available for public use. Additionally, a large room with a capacity of up to 120 individuals will be present, offering the flexibility to be divided into two smaller rooms to accommodate simultaneous meetings. This large conference room will also be accessible to the public for private events. An outdoor patio will be connected to the conference room making way for additional possibilities. Commissioner Randy Asay and Assessor Jesse Platt have been the driving forces behind making this a reality in our county.





FIRE PREVENTION ORDER: UTGRD-00000-25-01

Pursuant to regulations of the Department of the Interior, found at Title 43 CFR 9212.1 (h), the additional following acts are prohibited on Bureau of Land Management (BLM) lands, roads, waterways, and trails, in the State of Utah, until rescinded by the Green River District Manager.

Area Description:

All BLM managed lands within the Green River District in Carbon, Daggett, Duchesne, Emery, Grand, and Uintah Counties, Utah. **This order is effective starting June 28, 2025, at 12:01 a.m.** and will remain in effect until rescinded. This order also rescinds all previous orders covering BLM managed lands in this district.

Prohibited Acts:

1. Campfires using charcoal, solid fuels, or any ash-producing fuel, except in permanently constructed cement or metal fire pits located in agency developed campgrounds and picnic areas. Examples of solid fuels include, but are not limited to wood, charcoal, peat, coal, hexamine fuel tablets, wood pellets, corn, wheat, rye, and other grains. Devices fueled by petroleum or liquid petroleum gas with a shut-off valve are approved in all locations if there is at least three feet in diameter that is barren with no flammable vegetation.
2. Smoking except within an enclosed vehicle, covered areas, developed recreation site or while stopped in a cleared area of at least three feet in diameter that is barren with no flammable vegetation.
3. Grinding, cutting, and welding of metal.
4. Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine without a spark arresting device properly installed, maintained and in effective working order as determined by the Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) recommended practices J335 and J350. Refer to Title 43 CFR 8343.1.

Acts Prohibited by Fire Prevention Order No. UT 914-25-001 and 43 CFR § 9212.1(b) (Year-Round):

INTERIOR REGION 7 • UPPER COLORADO BASIN

COLORADO, NEW MEXICO, UTAH, WYOMING



1. The non-commercial use/discharge of explosives of any kind, incendiary or chemical devices, pyrotechnic devices, exploding targets, pressurized containers or canisters, and binary explosives.
2. The use/discharge of any kind of fireworks as defined by this order.

Binary Explosive Definition:

Binary explosive- includes, but is not limited to, pre-packaged products consisting of two separate components, usually an oxidizer like ammonium nitrate and a fuel such as aluminum or another metal. These binary explosives are defined by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosive in 27 CFR 555.

Fireworks Definition:

Fireworks- includes, but is not limited to, any device which produces noise, smoke, showers of sparks, or movement by combustion or explosive materials. These explosives are defined by the U.S. Department of Transportation in 49 CFR 173. This definition includes all classes of fireworks.

Permissible Acts:

1. Use of devices fueled by petroleum or liquid petroleum gas with a shut-off valve in all locations.
2. Use of campfires in permanently constructed cement or metal fire pits provided in agency developed campgrounds and picnic areas.

Exemptions:

1. All exemptions to the restrictions are obtained through local permits issued by the authorized officer for activities that will not conflict with the purpose of the order (Title 43 CFR 9212.3).
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Penalties:

Anyone in violation of this Fire Prevention Order may be subject to civil liability or criminal prosecution under any applicable law or BLM regulation. A violation of this Order may be classified as a Class A Misdemeanor Offense under 43 USC 1733(a) FLPMA, 18 USC 3559. Pursuant to 18 USC 3571, if the violation does not result in death, anyone who violates this order may be fined not more than \$100,000 and/or imprisoned for not more than 12 months. Liability for total fire suppression and damage costs incurred will be borne by the responsible party.

ORDER # UTCLO2504

Fire Restriction Order (Stage 1)

Due to current and forecasted weather conditions coupled with the record dry vegetation conditions and extreme fire danger throughout Utah, the State Forester has determined that measures must be taken to prevent the ignition of forest and rangeland fires. Therefore, pursuant to Utah State Law, Section 65A-8-212, the following acts (also known as “Stage 1 Fire Restrictions”) are prohibited in the areas described below until rescinded by the Utah State Forester:

1. No open fires of any kind except within established facilities in improved campgrounds or day-use areas on **public lands**. -OR- in permanently constructed fire pits at **permanent private dwellings** served by pressurized running water.
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle, trailer or building, a developed recreation site or while stopped in an area that is paved or free from dry vegetation.
3. Cutting, welding or grinding metal in areas of dry vegetation.
4. Operating a motorcycle, chainsaw, ATV, or other small internal combustion engine without an approved and working spark arrestor.
5. Discharging or using fireworks, tracer ammunition or other pyrotechnics devices including exploding targets.

*The fire restriction NECL02502 will be unchanged and will remain in effect until rescinded.

The following persons are exempted from the above prohibitions:

1. Persons with a permit or waiver issued by the Division, specifically authorizing a specified act at a specific location. A waiver does not relieve the permittee of liability if a fire does occur.
2. Any on-duty firefighter in the performance of an official duty.

Area Description: All state lands –AND– all unincorporated private lands within the state of Utah.

This order does not affect private lands within incorporated towns or city limits.

Any of the above acts is a violation of state law and is punishable by up to 6 months in jail and a fine of up to \$1,000. These restrictions will be enforced by county law enforcement.

Daggett School Board Highlights – May and June 2025

The Daggett School Board met on May 13th and June 16th. Some of the highlights from these two meetings are noted as follows:

May meeting Highlights...

6th Grader, Sam Cropper, was recognized as the Manila Elementary School Student of the Month for May. Way to go Sam!

The Board heard from three student groups that participated in leadership and FFA events this last month. Siegielin Montague and Hadlee Gahley reported back to the Board following their leadership trip to Washington DC. Alicia Stoll and Meagan Triplett also shared their experiences with the Board following their trip to Valley Forge (Philadelphia, PA). Keylie Boren and Reagan Browning discussed some of their accomplishments at Oklahoma City for their National FFA Convention. Their presentations were excellent. The Board feels that these special opportunities present our students with exceptional experiences that will help them in their lives and careers. Since our students will be the leaders of tomorrow, we're in good hands.

Jordynn Hewitt, representing Daggett County, requested the use of school buses and drivers for this year's Tower Rock Run on August 9th. Bus drivers would be paid by the County. This community event has been a success in prior years, and the Board is happy to again participate. The Board approved this request.

The Board reviewed the school lunch program, and while costs have been rising, the Board decided not to raise school lunch prices for the 2025-2026 school year.

The Board approved the preliminary school budget for FY 2025-2026. Budget- Business Administrator Missy Butler noted that estimated revenues have been projected low and the expenses high. After much discussion a 6% raise was approved for the preliminary budget to bring Daggett School District salaries to a more competitive level. This would, along with an increase in funding provided by the state legislature, bring the starting salary of a first year teacher to \$60,000/year.

June Highlights...

A Budget hearing began at 6PM to discuss the final budget for the 2026 school year. After a review and discussion, the final budget of \$7,084,028 was approved later in the regular board meeting. Details of the 2025-2026 budget can be found on the district's website.

MHS's graduation ceremony on May 22nd was outstanding. Nineteen students received their diplomas. A picture of the 2025 graduating class can be found in last month's "Fencepost".

MHS golf teams did well as both the boys' and girls' team took second in regional competitions. Ben Lail, Bracken Lail and Wyatt Muir qualified for the State Golf Tournament.

MHS boys' and girls' track teams placed 8th and 7th at the state track meet at BYU. Notable performances on the boys' side included Enoch Wilson in the 200M and 400M, Daniel Draper in the 1600M and 3200M, the 4x400M relay and the Sprint Medley relay, and Steele Browning in the high jump. On the girls' side Ruthanna Wilson placed in the 200M, 100M hurdles, 300M hurdles, and long jump.

The Board approved the Student Board Member policy on its final reading. We're looking forward to having a MHS student serve with us on the school board so if you're a junior or senior and are interested let Principal Browning or Superintendent Northcott know.

The Board approved the tuition agreement with Sweetwater School District #2 for Daggett School District to educate 5th through 12th grade students from Wyoming as we have done in the past. Sweetwater SD #2 will reimburse DSD \$18,074 for each Wyoming student that attends a DSD school.

The Board began discussions concerning declining student enrollment trends. While these trends could easily change up or down, the Board feels like we need to prepare for whatever comes our way. These discussions included Manila Elementary School (MES) minimum student numbers in one grade before considering combining grades into one classroom, Flaming Gorge Elementary School (FGE) minimum school size before considering other options, and FGE bus transportation options based upon a decline in student numbers. While some adjustments are being made for the 2025-2026 school, the Board will be looking to get community input on possible options so that we're prepared if, or when, decisions needs to be made.

The Board approved updated student handbooks for MHS, MES and FGE. These student handbooks can be viewed at the district website.

The Board also reviewed what our criteria might be to distribute "Shine" (Salary Supplement for Highly Needed Educators) funding from the 2024 Utah legislature to meet our most pressing teacher needs. A decision on the final criteria will be decided at our next meeting on August 19th. There will not be a Board meeting in July.

Also, the Board is planning a Town Hall meeting on September 23rd at 7PM at Manila. At this meeting the Board plans to answer any questions or discuss any concerns that are brought up. We look forward to your participation.

No-Bake Cheesecake

Directions

1. In a small bowl, mix cracker crumbs, brown sugar and cinnamon; stir in butter. Press onto bottom and 1 in. up side of an ungreased 9-in. springform pan. Refrigerate 30 minutes.
2. In a large bowl, beat cream cheese, sugar and lemon juice until smooth. Gradually add cream; beat until stiff peaks form. Transfer to prepared crust. Refrigerate, covered, overnight.
3. In a bowl, gently toss berries with sugar. Let stand until juices are released from berries, 15-30 minutes.
4. With a knife, loosen side of cheesecake from pan; remove rim. Serve cheesecake with topping.

Ingredients

- 1-1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs
- 1/3 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 cup butter, melted



Filling

- 2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, softened
- 1/3 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream

Topping

- 2 cups sliced fresh strawberries
- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 1 cup fresh raspberries
- 2 tablespoons sugar




