Raspberry Chocolate Chip

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350°.
2. Cream the butter and sugars with an electric mixer for 2-3 minutes.
3. Add the pudding mix and mix again until well combined.
4. Add the eggs and vanilla and mix for another 2-3 minutes.
5. Add the flour and baking soda and continue mixing.
6. Stir in the chocolate chips and then very gently fold in the raspberries.
7. Drop cookies by rounded teaspoonfuls (I use a cookie scoop) onto a greased cookie sheet or one that is lined with parchment paper or a silicone baking mat.
8. Bake for about 10 minutes or until the edges barely begin to brown. Let the cookies cool on the cookie sheets for a few minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

- 1 cup butter softened
- ½ cup brown sugar
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 large box 5.1 oz Instant Vanilla Pudding mix
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 ½ cups flour
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1 cup fresh raspberries halved


The Dump is open Monday's 9AM - 12PM, and First Saturday 9AM - 2PM. Trash collection is on Tuesday's.

Arleta Gillingham Marx, 86, passed away June 15th, 2025, in Tucson, AZ, from natural causes.

Arleta was a nature and wildlife lover. She collected shells, fossils, and rocks. Nothing gave her more pleasure than feeding birds and bunnies. She was an avid thrifter, and she was known by name at her favorite charity shops. Arleta was also known as the “Hat Lady” because she was rarely in public without her fedoras.

Arleta and her beloved husband, Jack, traveled from coast to coast due to his work as an electrician. While she fell in love with the Oregon coast, her favorite places were their homes in McKinnon, WY, and Tucson, AZ. Although she had not lived in Wisconsin for many years, it held a special place in her heart.

Arleta was preceded in death by her husband of 39 years, John (Jack). She also lost her parents, her son Anthony Paul, and brothers Larry and Allen.

Arleta is survived by daughters Renee Popova of Tucson, AZ; Tina Mickelson of Avoca, WI; Roberta Ledman of Richland Center, WI; Carmen Heaps of Pardeeville, WI; and Jackie Shipton of Las Vegas, NV. She is also survived by her sister Anita and brother Jerry. She leaves behind her sons-in-law, several nieces and nephews, 12 grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren, and 3 great-great-grandchildren.

Arleta is also survived by 7 special step-children: John, Steven, David, Brian, Beth, Barbara, Susan, and their families.

Barbara Lee Gerber Briggs

Encircled by her children Matthew, Lisa, and David at Haven Creek Assisted Living Facility in West Haven, Utah,

Barbara Lee Gerber Briggs, age 87, was reunited with her oldest daughter, Becky and husband Jim, on July 11th, 2025, while struggling to recover from a broken hip.

Born in Wooster, Ohio, to Robert King Gerber and Lillie Viona Nielsen on December 14, 1937, Barbara was the oldest of three children. The family moved to Logan, Utah, when Barbara was two years old. There she spent her childhood playing softball,

shooting guns, splashing in the ditch that ran in front of her home “down on the Island”, and caring for her younger brothers Robert (Bob) and Richard (Rick).

Affectionately known as “Babs”, she graduated from Logan High School in 1955 and went on to attend college at Utah State University joining the Aggie! Marching! Band! as a clarinetist. Four years later, she earned her baccalaureate in Mathematics and Physical Education. During this time, Barbara became acquainted with a rancher who was at USU working on his master’s degree after graduating from the University of Wyoming. They began dating when Jim contacted Barbara to “borrow a book” used in a class Barbara and Jim’s mother had taken together. The two were eventually married in the Logan Temple on July 15th, 1960.

After teaching school in Montpelier, Idaho, and Price, Utah, and supporting Jim as principal in Milford, she and Jim moved to Manila, Utah where they lived for the next forty years. Living in one of the most rural of rural towns in Utah is not for everyone, but here, proximate to the Flaming Gorge, Barbara thrived. After residing in the basement of the homestead house and the Linwood dance hall located on the “Walker Place”, Jim and Barbara built a home of their own on Highway 43. Here Barbara baled hay, sold fresh cream and milk, valiantly tried to grow a garden, raised her four children, and taught several subjects at Manila High School including math, PE, and seminary for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. She was also the school librarian. In addition, she became one of the first EMTs in Daggett County.

Always a stalwart member of the LDS church, she and Jim served two missions. One in Maine where she developed a fondness for lighthouses and one in California. Barbara was delighted with both calls when she learned neither required her to wear a dress. She also enjoyed teaching Gospel Doctrine and put her heart and soul into the calling of nursery leader.

Unable to manage the ranch due to Jim’s failing health, they left their beloved Manila and relocated to Roy, Utah in 2018. Following Jim’s death in 2020, Barbara moved in with Lisa. She spent her time reading, indexing, tending Lisa’s dog, Trixie, and keeping up on the doings of her six grandchildren, Avery, Niel, Eryn, Mari, Aleah, and Nathan.

Barbara will be honored on July 18th, 2025, at 11:00 am with a graveside service at the Logan City Cemetery, Logan, Utah. Barbara requested donations be made to Smile Train at supportsmiletrain.org in lieu of flowers. This organization provides quality cleft care for children. The family would like the staff and residents at Haven Creek to know how much their love and care for Barbara is appreciated.

FIRE PREVENTION ORDER: UTGRD-00000-25-01

Pursuant to regulations of the Department of the Interior, found at Title 43 CFR 9212.1 (h), the additional following acts are prohibited on Bureau of Land Management (BLM) lands, roads, waterways, and trails, in the State of Utah, until rescinded by the Green River District Manager.

Area Description:

All BLM managed lands within the Green River District in Carbon, Daggett, Duchesne, Emery, Grand, and Uintah Counties, Utah. **This order is effective starting June 28, 2025, at 12:01 a.m.** and will remain in effect until rescinded. This order also rescinds all previous orders covering BLM managed lands in this district.

Prohibited Acts:

1. Campfires using charcoal, solid fuels, or any ash-producing fuel, except in permanently constructed cement or metal fire pits located in agency developed campgrounds and picnic areas. Examples of solid fuels include, but are not limited to wood, charcoal, peat, coal, hexamine fuel tablets, wood pellets, corn, wheat, rye, and other grains. Devices fueled by petroleum or liquid petroleum gas with a shut-off valve are approved in all locations if there is at least three feet in diameter that is barren with no flammable vegetation.
2. Smoking except within an enclosed vehicle, covered areas, developed recreation site or while stopped in a cleared area of at least three feet in diameter that is barren with no flammable vegetation.
3. Grinding, cutting, and welding of metal.
4. Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine without a spark arresting device properly installed, maintained and in effective working order as determined by the Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) recommended practices J335 and J350. Refer to Title 43 CFR 8343.1.

Acts Prohibited by Fire Prevention Order No. UT 914-25-001 and 43 CFR § 9212.1(b) (Year-Round):

INTERIOR REGION 7 • UPPER COLORADO BASIN

COLORADO, NEW MEXICO, UTAH, WYOMING

Fire Update

1. The non-commercial use/discharge of explosives of any kind, incendiary or chemical devices, pyrotechnic devices, exploding targets, pressurized containers or canisters, and binary explosives.
2. The use/discharge of any kind of fireworks as defined by this order.

Binary Explosive Definition:

Binary explosive- includes, but is not limited to, pre-packaged products consisting of two separate components, usually an oxidizer like ammonium nitrate and a fuel such as aluminum or another metal. These binary explosives are defined by the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosive in 27 CFR 555.

Fireworks Definition:

Fireworks- includes, but is not limited to, any device which produces noise, smoke, showers of sparks, or movement by combustion or explosive materials. These explosives are defined by the U.S. Department of Transportation in 49 CFR 173. This definition includes all classes of fireworks.

Permissible Acts:

1. Use of devices fueled by petroleum or liquid petroleum gas with a shut-off valve in all locations.
2. Use of campfires in permanently constructed cement or metal fire pits provided in agency developed campgrounds and picnic areas.

Exemptions:

1. All exemptions to the restrictions are obtained through local permits issued by the authorized officer for activities that will not conflict with the purpose of the order (Title 43 CFR 9212.3).
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

Penalties:

Anyone in violation of this Fire Prevention Order may be subject to civil liability or criminal prosecution under any applicable law or BLM regulation. A violation of this Order may be classified as a Class A Misdemeanor Offense under 43 USC 1733(a) FLPMA, 18 USC 3559. Pursuant to 18 USC 3571, if the violation does not result in death, anyone who violates this order may be fined not more than \$100,000 and/or imprisoned for not more than 12 months. Liability for total fire suppression and damage costs incurred will be borne by the responsible party.




