

Cookie Cake

Instructions


1. Preheat oven to 350°. Line the bottom of a 9-in. springform pan with parchment. In a large bowl, cream butter and sugars until light and fluffy, 5-7 minutes. Beat in egg, egg yolk and vanilla. In another bowl, whisk flour, cornstarch, baking soda and salt; gradually beat into creamed mixture. Stir in chips. Press onto the bottom of prepared pan.
2. Bake until golden brown, 20-25 minutes. Cool on a wire rack 10 minutes. Loosen sides from pan with a knife; cool completely. Remove rim from pan. Carefully remove cookie cake from bottom pan; transfer to serving platter.
3. In a large bowl, beat butter, confectioners' sugar, vanilla and enough milk to reach piping consistency. If desired, beat in food coloring. Pipe around edge of cookie cake. If desired, garnish with sprinkles.



Ingredients

- 3/4 cup butter, softened
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 large egg plus 1 large egg yolk, room temperature
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup semisweet chocolate chips
- Frosting:
 - 1/2 cup butter, softened
 - 4-1/2 cups confectioners' sugar
 - 1-1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
 - 5 to 6 tablespoons 2% milk
 - Optional: Food coloring and sprinkles

County Update

Daggett School Board Highlights – August and September 2025

After a July recess the Daggett School Board met on August 19th in Manila and September 9th at Dutch John.

August highlights...

The Board was introduced to and welcomed three new employees. Principal Browning introduced Miranda Bailey and Holly Duerichen who will both be working at Manila HS with some involvement at Manila Elementary School also. Scott Taylor will be teaching 4th grade at Manila Elementary School. We're excited to have them join us here in Manila as employees of Daggett School District.

Anna Dupaix reported to the Board on her trip to the FCCLA (Family, Career and Community Leader of America) National Convention in Orlando, Florida this summer. Anna is the Vice President of History for this state organization. Way to go Anna!

The Board discussed how they would spend the \$113,000 in SHiNE (Salary Supplement for Highly Needed Educators) funding that we have received from the state. The Board requested that Superintendent Northcott do some additional research to determine if the district's proposal to provide all qualifying teachers with this supplement would be possible.

Manila HS has two foreign exchange students attending school this year. Welcome Sara and Amil!

Principal Browning reported that the start of school went smoothly. She also noted that the MHS policy of no cell phones or smart watches in school has been going well and the atmosphere seems to be so much different (better)!

The Board is planning a Town Hall meeting on October 21st at 7 PM. Discussion topics will include any topic that is brought up along with our Strategic Plan, student safety, school size, transportation routes, our school bond and building needs. The meeting will be held at Manila HS with a video link to the Dutch John Elementary School. We look forward to your participation. Everyone is welcome!

September highlights...

The Board recognized Kendyl Bair as the Manila Elementary Student of the month. Way to go Kendyl!

The Board reviewed and approved the distribution of the \$113,000 of SHiNE funding to our qualifying teachers.

The Board approved Anna Dupaix to attend the FCCLA's Capitol Leadership training in Washington DC as a state officer in November. There is no travel cost to the District for this training.


The Board also attended the USBA (Utah School Board Association) Region IV meeting on September 16th at Flaming Gorge Lodge. The Uintah and Duchesne School Boards were also present at this meeting.

Board President Chelsey Lail and Board member Ross Catron, along with Superintendent Northcott, attended the USBA Leadership Academy at Bryce Canyon on September 25-27. Every Utah school board attended this training which focused on making each school board better.


