## Mexican Champurrado

### Instructions

1. Sift masa harina, flour and salt into a large bowl. Stir in 3/4 cup warm water. Knead until mixture forms a smooth ball, 8-10 minutes.
2. Weigh out 10-1/2 ounces masa mixture (save remaining for another use). Add 2 cups water to a blender. Break masa into small pieces and add to blender. Process until smooth.
3. In a large saucepan over medium heat, combine remaining 2 quarts water, piloncillo, Mexican chocolate, cinnamon stick and cloves. Bring to a boil, stirring occasionally. Remove and discard cinnamon stick and cloves. Pour masa mixture through a fine mesh strainer into the chocolate mixture. Reduce heat; simmer 20 minutes, stirring frequently. Stir in vanilla. Remove from the heat. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.



### Ingredients

- 2 cups masa harina
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup warm water
- 2-1/2 quarts water, divided
- 2 piloncillo cones (3 ounces each)
- 2 disks (3 ounces each) Mexican chocolate
- 1 cinnamon stick (3 inches)
- 3 whole cloves
- 3 teaspoons vanilla extract


The Landfill is open every Tuesday from 8am-12pm and the First Saturday of every month from 8am-12pm. Oct 1st - March 31st.

# County Update

## Daggett School Board Highlights

October & November 2025

### October Highlights

The Board started its October 14<sup>th</sup> meeting with a hearing to begin the process which would allow the district to continue its four-day school week. This process requires two hearings and an application to the State School Board. An application and subsequent approval is required every three years. There were no public comments.

Following the hearing the Board convened its meeting at 6PM. First order of business was to recognize Bobcat Flannery as the Manila Elementary School (MES) Student of the Month. Bobcat is a 2<sup>nd</sup> grader and is a joy to work with and a great friend. Congratulations Bobcat!!

Gracie Clegg, a student body officer of Manila High School, presented to the Board the things that have been happening at Manila High School (MHS). Jr. High Volleyball hosted a volleyball tournament in Manila last weekend, and there were 14 teams that participated. The Jr. High class had a Halloween Party with about 95% of the class attending. The FFA held a goat roping at the Potter's Ranch in McKinnon, Wyoming. FCCLA attended the Fall Leadership Conference for the State Officers. Cross Country Region took place here in Manila, and Daniel Draper took 2<sup>nd</sup> and Teka Triplet took 5<sup>th</sup>. The Boys team placed 1<sup>st</sup> and the Girls team placed 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Honor Roll students got to attend the Green Acre Corn Maze.

The Board approved the Fraud Audit Report and recommendations of the Audit Committee.

The Board approved the LEA (Local Education Agency) endorsements for six teachers to allow them to teach in certain areas or subjects beyond their initial certification.

Principal Terry asked the Board to approve a waiver for the Flaming Gorge Elementary School (FGE) Community Council, as they have not been able to get a full council, and they still have business to do. The Board approved this request.

The Board approved a MES Trust Land Plan Amendment that will allow funding that was budgeted, but not spent, to be used to pay for the new aide position at the school.

Principals Browning and Terry updated the Board on the Strategic Plan that the committee has been working on.

### November Highlights

On November 17<sup>th</sup> the second hearing to consider continuing the four-day school week was held in Manila. Alan Staggs presented to those in attendance the rational of why the district desires to continue a four-day school week. All of the metrics that were considered showed a positive result attributable to a four-day school week. There were only positive comments at this hearing.

Following the hearing the Board began its regular board meeting at 6PM. First off, the Board heard from Kyle Green of Suire Auditors. Kyle presented to the Board the results of their recent financial audit. The audit showed that Daggett School district is in a very good financial position and is managing all its financial obligations in an acceptable manner. The audit was positive. The Board approved the financial audit.

The Board recognized Brodie Elder as the MES Student of the Month. Brodie is a 5<sup>th</sup> grader that lives in Dutch John and goes to school in Manila. Brodie also treats everyone with respect. Good job Brodie!!

MHS student body officer Daniel Draper made a presentation to the Board about MHS activities that have occurred this last month (refer to separate article in this Fencepost). Good job Daniel!

The Board approved the four-day school week application to the State School Board.

The Board adopted the school year calendar for 2027 -2028. Classes will begin on August 18<sup>th</sup> and end on May 25<sup>th</sup>. Christmas break will begin on December 23<sup>rd</sup> with classes starting back up on January 3<sup>rd</sup>. Spring break will begin on March 17<sup>th</sup> and end on March 26<sup>th</sup>.

The Board heard a presentation from Jessica Campbell concerning the District's drug testing policy. This policy will be reviewed at an upcoming board meeting.

The Board is planning its District Social on December 9<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM at the Manila Elementary School. All district employees and their spouses are invited.

The Board sponsored a Town Hall meeting in Manila on October 21<sup>st</sup> at 7 PM, with a video link to Dutch John. The meeting was well attended. The presentations and discussions focused on our strategic plan, student safety, minimum class and school sizes, busing and transportation routes, building upgrade needs such as the district office (un-reinforced concrete) and the FGE gym roof. A new bus barn was also mentioned as a need. In anticipation that our existing bond will be paid off in another three years, the Board is beginning to plan for the capital projects needed. Thanks to all who participated. Your input was appreciated!


