MONTHLY RECIPE

Pecan Sandies

Instructions


1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C).
2. Spread pecans evenly onto a baking sheet.
3. Bake in the preheated oven until fragrant and lightly toasted, 5 to 10 minutes. Cool completely, then coarsely chop in a food processor.
4. Beat butter in a large bowl with an electric mixer until creamy. Add sugar; beat until light and fluffy. Beat in egg yolk, vanilla, and salt until well combined. Slowly mix in pecans. Stir in flour until dough begins to come together.
5. Roll dough into a ball and divide it in half. Roll each dough half into a 1 1/2-inch-thick log. Wrap each log in wax paper and refrigerate, 4 hours to overnight.
6. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
7. Unwrap dough logs and cut into slices, about 1/3-inch thick. Place on the prepared baking sheet.
8. Bake in the preheated oven until edges are golden, 12 to 15 minutes. Cool cookies on a wire rack.



Ingredients

- 3/4 cup pecans
- 1 cup butter, softened
- 3/4 cup white sugar
- 1 large egg yolk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour


The Landfill is open every Tuesday from 8am-12pm and the First Saturday of every month from 8am-12pm. Oct 1st - March 31st.

Daggett School Board Highlights January 2026

The Daggett School Board met on January 13th. The Board's first order of business was to recognize Manila Elementary School's students of the month. Macrae Smith (2nd grade) and Parker Slaugh (6th grade) are the school's December and January students of the month. Macrae is a true superstar and is a friend to everyone. Parker is incredibly kind and the school is a better place with him there. Way to go Macrae and Parker!

Aaron Weight and some of his staff addressed the board concerning UBTech opportunities. UBTech provides significant learning opportunities for both students and adults. They offer IT, Medical Assistant, Electrical Apprenticeship, Pharmacy Technician, and Nursing Assistant training. They also offer Automotive, Construction, Welding and Diesel programs. Secondary students can participate in these programs during the summer to earn college credits for free. If you want more info just look up UBTech.

The Board continued its discussion of our drug testing policy. Mikayla Potter, the district nurse, played an active role

in this discussion. This item will be on our February agenda.

Oakley Browning, Adison Potter and DJ Potter shared with the Board student activities over the last several months. We were pleased to hear about what was going on (look for their article in this addition of the Fence Post)! Great presentation students!

The Board was notified that the Utah State School Board (USBE) was impressed with our request to continue the 4-day school week and will consider its approval at their next meeting.

The Board heard a presentation from the MHS Land Judging Team that has qualified to compete at the National Land and Range Judging Contest in Oklahoma City on May 4-8, 2026. Oakley Browning, Adison Potter and DJ Potter requested that the Board approve their travel to this contest. The Board approved their request. Good luck at the Nationals!

Earlier this month the Board attended the annual USBA (Utah School Board Association) conference at SLC. Board members were able to attend various breakout sessions throughout the conference. School building projects, bridging employment with education, AI in the classroom, current legal issues and school trust lands were just some of the topics. The Board also heard from Kim Lear, a leading authority on generational research. Attendance at this conference is designed to improve local school boards so we're excited to learn and improve.

The Board reviewed and discussed public comments on the district's strategic plan. We appreciate your input and thoughts. Many of these comments have been incorporated into the plan already. Finalizing this plan will be on our agenda over the next few months.


