Candied Lemon Pound Cake



Instructions

1. For cake: Preheat oven to 325°. Butter and flour an 8x4x2-inch loaf pan; set aside. In a medium bowl, combine all-purpose flour, almond flour, baking powder and salt.
2. In a large bowl, beat butter on medium speed 30 seconds. Add 3/4 cup granulated sugar and the lemon zest. Beat until light and fluffy. Add eggs and egg yolk, one at a time, beating well after each addition, scraping sides of bowl occasionally. Gently fold flour mixture into batter. Fold in 1/3 cup chopped candied lemon peel. Spread batter in prepared pan.
3. Bake until golden brown and a wooden toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, about 1 hour. Cool in pan on a wire rack 10 minutes. Remove from pan.
4. For lemon syrup: In a small saucepan, combine 1/4 cup granulated sugar, the water, 2 tablespoons lemon juice and the rum (if using). Bring to a boil, stirring to dissolve sugar. Generously (and repeatedly) brush warm cake on all sides with the syrup. You will use a lot of the syrup, but not quite all. Cool completely on wire rack.
5. For glaze: In a small bowl, whisk together powdered sugar and 2 to 3 tablespoons lemon juice until smooth. Place cake and rack over a sheet of wax paper. Pour glaze over cooled cake, nudging it over the sides with the back of a spoon to fully coat. Transfer to a serving plate. Let glaze dry 2 hours at room temperature. Decorate cake with candied peel.

Ingredients

- 1 1/3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/3 cup almond flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon fine sea salt
- 11 tablespoons unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup granulated sugar, divided
- 1 tablespoon lemon zest
- 2 eggs
- 1 egg yolk
- 1/3 cup chopped candied lemon peel*, plus extra for garnish
- 1/4 cup water
- 4 - 5 tablespoons lemon juice, divided
- 1 tablespoon dark rum (optional)
- 2 cups powdered sugar, sifted

The Daggett School Board met on February 10th in Manila. The Board conducted a fee hearing at 6 PM to consider modifications to the district's fee schedule. There were no public comments received during the hearing. The regular board meeting followed, and the Board's first order of business was to recognize Manila Elementary School's student of the month, Reed Rose. Reed is in the 4th grade and is a great student who leads by example and likes to share jokes. Way to go Reed!

Gracie Clegg, MHS Student Body President, reviewed all the major events happening at MHS over the last month. She made a great presentation, some of which is noted in another article in the Fencepost. The Board was impressed with all that is going on at MHS. Keep up the great work MHS students!

The Board approved the School Safety, Family Medical Leave Act, Employee Leave and Mandatory Drug Testing policies. The Board also approved the revised fee schedule.

One of the items that was finalized at this Board meeting was the Daggett School District Strategic Plan. This has been a substantial effort and involved participation from parents, teachers and staff over the last several years. We look forward to implementing this plan. You can view this plan on the district's website (to be posted soon).

The Board reviewed the results of an internal review of how the Board is functioning. The results indicated that while there is room for improvement, the Board is functioning well. One of the items that has challenged the Board in the past has been the lack of a current strategic plan. Now that a strategic plan has been approved, we believe that the Board will be able to function even better.

The Board is directly responsible for the supervision of two district positions: the District Superintendent and the District Business Administrator. These two positions are reviewed every two years and if warranted, a new two-year contract is offered. The Board feels like our current BA, Missy Butler, is doing an excellent job. Consequently, the Board intends to renew her contract. Well done Ms. Butler.

Magan Triplett, Anna Gibson, Gracie Clegg and Daniel Draper requested out of state travel for them to attend the Close Up School Program Washington, DC trip this summer. The Board approved their travel request and looks forward to hearing from them following their trip.

Kali Briggs, MES principal, presented to the Board the Middle of the Year Acadience reports. The reports show improvement in most areas indicating that our elementary kids are doing well.

The Board also heard a report on its daycare program. This program is currently serving its maximum number of kids it can legally serve due to the size of the facility. There are several teachers indicating that if this program was not in place they would not be able to teach since there are no other childcare options in Manila. The cost of this program is about \$60,000 - \$70,000 a year.

The Manila Elementary School teachers and staff voiced their concerns to the Board about combining the Manila 2nd and 3rd grades (5 and 4 students respectively) into a single classroom with 9 students. They indicated that despite their best efforts, this combination made it difficult to teach and that we could better serve these students by putting them into separate classes. They requested that the Board consider other options for the upcoming school year. In the discussion that followed the Board acknowledged that this decision was not taken lightly and that combined classrooms are a huge challenge to make work. However, declining enrollment will continue to present significant challenges to the District in the upcoming years. The Board will consider other options as we approach a new fiscal year and have more up to date enrollment and funding figures.

The Board very much appreciates our teachers voicing their concerns. We know we have excellent teachers that care for their students!

Our next Board meeting is scheduled for March 10th in Manila.
