

# **Rules & Regulations For The Cemeteries Owned And Operated By Daggett County**

1. No use of sterilization or pesticides.
2. Landscaping will be provided by the County. No shrubs, bushes, flowers, fences or trees will be planted in the cemetery by individuals. All landscaping will be under the direction of the Cemetery Board.
3. Vehicles on roadway and in parking areas only.
4. Family lots with existing vertical stones now will be grand fathered in and be allowed to use vertical stones on the remainder of the Family lots. Any new Family or Single lots will only be allowed to use flat stones.
5. Monuments shall be of stone, concrete or metal. Monuments must be flat (See # 4 for exception) and be placed on a good concrete foundation six (6) inches deep or deeper and will extend six (6) inches beyond the furthest projection of the monument to provide a clear strip so the lawn may be conveniently cut without coming in contact with the monument. Any built in vases or containers must be inside the mow strip and not part of the mow strip. Foundations placed level and approximately one (1) inch above the lawn. Only One Monument or Marker per grave. All monuments will be placed Monday through Friday under the supervision of the groundskeeper.
6. Vaults are required. All caskets must be placed in either fiberglass, metal or concrete vaults.
7. There can be up to four (4) cremation graves in a single lot, plus one burial. Size of cremation opening will be 16" x 16" x 3', unless Mortuary contacts County Office with alternate dimensions.
8. Family lots are not to be split up without Commission approval.
9. All flowers placed on graves during Memorial Day will be removed without notice after ten days. Removal of flowers throughout the rest of the year will be removed at discretion of cemetery grounds keeper, without any notice.
10. Temporary Memorials will be removed without notice by cemetery employees when they become withered, discolored, torn, broken or vandalized. Temporary memorials are items such as glass containers, wires, sticks, iron rods, pegs, ceramic pots or other containers.

11. No animals allowed in the cemetery unattended.
12. Indigent burial – Reserve Section 16 Lot 45 & 46 For Indigent Burial

**Fees:** Burial in the Cemetery is open to all residents and nonresidents of Daggett County Utah.

1. A resident is a person who can prove residency or previous residency in Daggett County, Utah
2. For Residents of Daggett County only; single lots will sell for \$100.00 each, four adjoining lots will sell for \$350.00 and eight adjoining lots will sell for \$550.00
3. For non-county residents; each lot will sell for \$1,000.00.
4. Burial Certificates will be issued to each lot owner.
5. The County will be responsible for opening and closing all graves. Resident cost is \$200.00, non-resident cost is \$300.00 and \$75.00 for Cremation assessed upon burial request. If burial requires County Employees to work over time (weekends) there will be an additional \$100.00 charge.
6. Re-Sale of any lots will be subject to Commission approval.
7. Any plot not paid up with yearly donation within ten (10) years shall be considered unclaimed. After a reasonable search for the owner unclaimed lots may be resold by Daggett County. In the event that the owner should subsequently appear, a new certificate will be issued.
8. Everyone owning a lot will be asked for a donation of \$25.00 per lot, per year for upkeep.
