Dear public official,

Williams operates a high-pressure natural gas transmission pipeline in your area known as Northwest Pipeline. I am writing to you to make certain you are aware that it is in your community, that you know where it is located, and that you know how to receive more information about this pipeline if you need it.

The enclosed map and information on the back of this letter provide more information about our facilities. It is important to us that you are familiar with our pipeline facilities in your community and that any questions you have about our operations are promptly addressed. You can find information about pipelines operating in you community by accessing the National Pipeline Mapping System (NPMS) on the Internet at www.npms.phmsa.dot.gov. NPMS provides a list of pipelines, their operator and operator contact information.

Williams meets with emergency responders in your area to educate them about pipelines and prepare them for potential hazards that may be present. Detailed information has been provided to emergency response agencies in you jurisdiction, including a link to the following online emergency training program: www.williams.com/emergency training. In addition, you should be aware that some pipe segments in your area have been designated as high consequence areas due to population density or other factors. As a result, in accordance with recent federal regulations, we have developed a supplemental threat assessment ant prevention plan, known as an Integrity Management Plan can be found on the Internet at www.williams.com/safety.
